Summer Hours for Selected Offices at LAVC

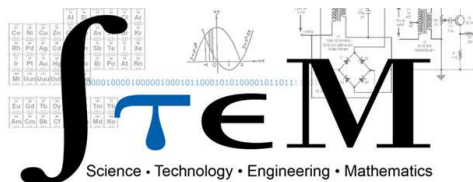
The LAVC Admissions & Records Office, Graduation Office, Assessment Center, International Student Services Office, and Veteran Student Services Office will have special summer hours of operation from

LAVC to Host a Summer Youth Employment Program

The L.A. Scholars Program will hold a Summer Youth Employment Program on Monday, June 21 from 5-7 p.m. in Monarch Hall. There will be at least 300 high school students in attendance. The L.A. Scholars Program provides Los Angeles youth between the ages of 17 and 24 with summer employment, workforce readiness training and certification, and the opportunity to take a college level class at Los Angeles Valley College. Participants will work in a variety of entry-level jobs in transportation, health care, media/entertainment, etc. In order to be eligible for the program, participants must meet one of the following requirements: be a 17-19 year old TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) recipient, be a foster youth, or be an 18-24 year old receiving general relief, food stamps or CalWORKs. **All participating students must complete all the necessary eligibility documents (available at www.lavc.edu/lascholars) and return them by Friday, June 25 in Campus Center, Room 106 from 9 a.m.-5 p.m.** For more information, contact the Office of Student Services at (818) 947-2543.



Don't Miss Your Chance Sign Up for the STEM Summer Bridge Program

The LAVC STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) Program will be holding a Summer Mathematics and Engineering Bridge Programs from June 21-July 1, 2010. The two-week programs, which comprises of a mathematics program and an engineering program, is open to students who are interested in STEM majors. The Math Program will group participants based on their matriculation assessment test. Those students will learn key math skills, how to excel at the placement test, and review for the assessment test. At the end of the bridge, Math Program participants will take the matriculation test again, which will replace their earlier assessment score. In the Engineering Program, students will be in specific groups and be involved in targeted workshops for Life Science majors, for Physical Science majors, for Engineering and Mathematics majors.
