
#### You're Invited to the LAVC Town Hall Meeting on the "Big Picture"

The Pacesetter is a sweepstakes award to honor the top four schools in the state in mail-in and on-the-spot competition, and it is only given at the annual state convention; schools must win a newspaper general excellence

or online general excellence award to qualify. The three other schools that won the award include Contra Costa College, Mount San Antonio College and Cypress College. The title of General Excellence is judged on three consecutive published issues, and is based on categories such as writing style, photography, layout and content.
