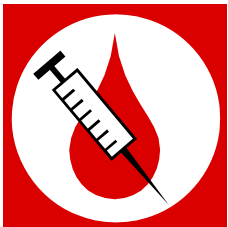
LAVC Math STEM to Hold STEM Awareness Week Activities on March 10-14

You’re Invited to Celebrate the 50th Anniversary of the LAVC Art Gallery! Don’t Miss the Opening Reception & Program for “Passing Time: 50 Years of Exhibitions” on March 13

The LAVC Art Gallery is celebrating its 50th anniversary (1964-2014) with an exhibition of highlights from past shows titled “Passing Time: 50 Years of Exhibitions”. It will hold an opening reception and program for the exhibition on Thursday, March 13 from 7-9 p.m.; the program will take place at 8 p.m. in the Art History Lecture Hall in Art 103. This exhibition presents highlights from 23 exhibitions held in the gallery during its first half-century including “Japanese American Photography in Los Angeles, 1920-1945” (shown in 1982), a presentation of recovered photographs once exhibited world-wide but believed lost during the Japanese American relocation of WWII; “The Furniture of Gustav Stickley” (shown in 1983), a survey of the American Arts & Crafts master; Creativity in the Shadow of Political Oppression: “Recent Czechoslovakian Graphic Art from the Werksman Collection” (shown in 1991), an exhibit of prints by artists who produced work about, and in spite of, the political tyranny of the Communist era in Czechoslovakia; “Sitting Pretty: Chairs of the Twentieth Century” (shown in 2007), celebrated the beauty of these functional necessities; “Cultural Windows: the Art of Ruth Asawa, Ynez Johnston, Betye Saar” (shown in 2010) explored the effects of various cultures and subcultures upon the work of these three veteran woman artists. The program will include acknowledgements, stories and a panel
