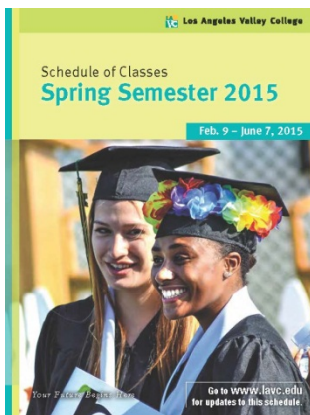

Attention Students, Faculty & Staff!—LAVC will Temporarily Change Vehicular Access into the Campus for the First Two Weeks of the Spring 2015 Semester to Help Minimize Traffic Congestion

From February 9-19, the College Sheriff will temporarily close the driveway to the Fulton Avenue main entrance (roundabout), and will block off left turns into campus parking areas to help ease traffic congestion at the beginning of the semester. Please keep in mind, during the first two weeks of the semester:

- Vehicular access to the main Fulton Avenue entrance (roundabout) from Hatteras Street and Fulton Avenue will be closed.

- All left turns into campus parking lots from southbound lanes of Fulton Avenue and the eastbound lanes of Burbank Boulevard will be blocked. All students, faculty, staff and guests visiting the campus should plan to take a route to the campus that will enable them to make a right turn into the campus.
- The College Sheriff will have officers and cadets stationed at the entrance of all student parking lots (Lots A, B, C, D, F, G, L and M) from Monday-Thursday between 7 a.m.-1 p.m. and 4-10 p.m. to help direct traffic and close full parking lots.
- Staff parking in College Road North will only be accessible from the Fulton Avenue entrance to Lot B.
- Staff parking in College Road South will only be accessible from the Burbank Avenue entrance to Lot A.
- If a parking lot is closed, faculty/staff must show their valid Valley College parking permit to the officer or cadet stationed at the parking lot entrance.
- Access to the campus for Access Services Vehicles to the disabled student drop-off and pick-up location in the main entrance circle will only be available from the Fulton Avenue entrance to Lot B.
- All students will be given a two-week grace period for parking (in student lots only) during the beginning of the Spring Semester; however, parking permits will be required in all faculty/staff parking areas. Students are encouraged to purchase their parking permit from the [LAVC Business Office](#).

The college Sheriff reminds everyone to obey traffic laws and drive safely. All legal violations will be enforced. Visit the [LAVC Campus Map](#) to view entrances to all parking areas.

The LAVC Business Office and the LAVC Monarch Store (Bookstore) will have the following extended hours of operation during the Spring 2015 Rush Period (February 9-20):

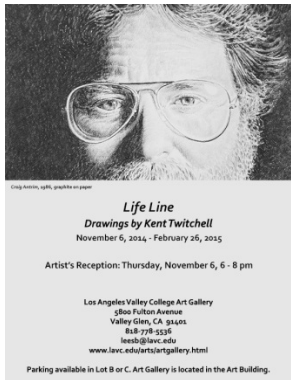
- ***The LAVC Business Office will be open Monday-Thursday, February 9-12 and 17-19 from 8 a.m.-7 p.m. and Friday, February 20 from 8 a.m.-3:45 p.m.***
- ***The LAVC Monarch Store will be open Monday-Thursday, February 9-12 and 17-19 from 7:30 a.m.-8:30 p.m., Friday, February 20 from 7:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m., and Saturday, February 20 from 9 a.m.-1 p.m.***

The LAVC Business Office is the last step in the student registration process; it collects all registration fees, including student parking permit fees and issues the student Registration Receipt. It is located on the corner of Campus Drive and Hatteras (adjacent to the LAVC Parking Structure). The LAVC Monarch Store (Bookstore) sells textbooks, school supplies, computers, college-logo gear, and food on campus. In addition, it rents textbooks to students, and holds a textbook buyback to allow students to sell back their gently used textbooks. The LAVC Monarch Store is located on the first floor of Campus Center facing Monarch Square. LAVC Reopens its Special Exhibition by LA Muralist Kent Twitchell in the LAVC Art Gallery from February 9-26

The LAVC Art Gallery will reopen its "Life Line: Drawings by Kent Twitchell" exhibition from February 9-26 in the LAVC Art Gallery in the Art Building. This exhibition by Los Angeles-based muralist Kent Twitchell focuses on his life-long devotion to drawing as his primary medium, and also his connections to his subjects. It highlights the artist's small graphite on paper renderings that are both intimate and engaging in scale. Culling from the artist's oeuvre, some of the drawings in this exhibition are being displayed for the first time. Twitchell is renowned for his larger-than-life, realistic portrayals of celebrities and creative luminaries in murals sprawling Los Angeles's buildings and freeways. As the exhibition title suggests, "Life Line" conjures up multiple associations. "Life Line" also serves as a stimulating pairing to the monumental and iconic mural of "The Old Woman of the Freeway" (or "Freeway Lady") that will be installed on the side of this campus's Student Services Center this year. The exhibit, which is free to the public, will be on display in the LAVC Art Gallery in the Art Building and will be open Monday-Thursday from 11 a.m.-2 p.m. and 6-9 p.m.; the Art Gallery is closed on February 16. LAVC Family Resource Center to Offer Infant/Toddler, and Creative Activities for Preschoolers Playgroups this Spring; Register Today!

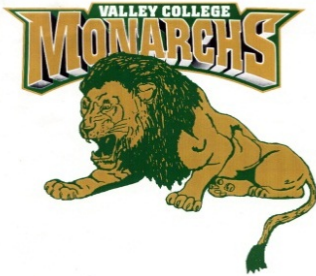
The LAVC Family Resource Center (FRC) is accepting registrations for its Spring 2015 Infant and Toddler Playgroups (birth through 30 months) and its new Creative Activities Playgroup (2.5 year old through 3.5 years old). Need to Take the HiSET® (High School Equivalency Test)? LAVC to Offer the Computer-Based and the Paper-Based Test; Practice Test Also Offered

The LAVC CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) Program is now accepting registrations for the HiSET® (High School Equivalency Test). LAVC is an official HiSET testing site; the computer-based test will be offered on Tuesday-Wednesday, February 10-11, and the paper-based test on Friday-Saturday, February 20-21. It will also offer the practice test on Friday, February 20; practice tests are also available by appointment. HiSET® is the new alternative to the GED. The CA State Board of Education approved the HiSET® for individuals to earn a California High School Equivalency Certificate. It is offered as a paper-based or computer-based test, and covers the following subject areas: Language Arts-

Reading & Writing, Science, Social Studies and Mathematics. Both types of tests are offered on a regular basis. The fee for the full test is \$150.00 (non-refundable). The fee for the practice test is \$10.
