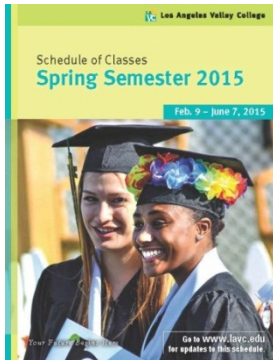

Need to Pay Your Fees or Buy a Parking Permit? Want to Purchase or Rent Your Textbooks? The LAVC Business Office and the LAVC Monarch Store are Offering Extended Hours of Operation During the First Two Weeks of the Spring 2015 Semester

The LAVC Business Office and the LAVC Monarch Store (Bookstore) will have the following extended hours of operation during the Spring 2015 Rush Period (February 9-20):

- **The LAVC Business Office will be open Monday-Thursday, February 9-12 and 17-19 from 8 a.m.-7 p.m. and Friday, February 20 from 8 a.m.-3:45 p.m.**
- **The LAVC Monarch Store will be open Monday-Thursday, February 9-12 and 17-19 from 7:30 a.m.-8:30 p.m., Friday, February 20 from 7:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m., and Saturday, February 21 from 9 a.m.-1 p.m.**

The LAVC Business Office is the last step in the student registration process; it collects all registration fees, including student parking permit fees and issues the student Registration Receipt. It is located on the corner of Campus Drive and Hatteras (adjacent to the LAVC Parking Structure). The LAVC Monarch Store (Bookstore) sells textbooks, school supplies, computers, college-logo gear, and food on campus. In addition, it rents textbooks to students, and holds a textbook buyback to allow students to sell back their gently used textbooks. The LAVC Monarch Store is located on the first floor of Campus Center facing Monarch Square. Sign Up to Help Save a Life! LAVC to Hold a Marrow Donor Registry Drive on February 18

The LAVC Student Health Center and Be the Match are partnering up to find the cure for blood cancers with a “Marrow Donor Registry Drive” event on Wednesday, February 18 from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. in the LAVC Student Services Plaza. This drive is being organized to help Dr. Shane Frehlich, CSUN Faculty President and Professor of Kinesiology, who was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML). After four rounds of chemotherapy, he was declared cancer free. Unfortunately, on November 6, shortly after the birth of his 3rd son,

Shane was admitted to the hospital because the cancer came out of remission. His only chance to cure this illness is a marrow transplant. Unfortunately, no one in his family is a marrow donor match in the Be the Match registry. Students, faculty, staff, and the community are invited to help Shane (and thousands of other patients in need of a marrow transplant) by registering to be a donor through the Be the Match Registry, and see if they are a match for Shane or any other patient in need. Attention Faculty & Staff! Have You Given LAVC Your Cell Phone and Alternate Email to Receive Emergency Notifications? LAVC is urging all LAVC faculty and staff to provide emergency contact information to Valley College through the new [LAVC Connect portal](#). During a campus emergency, LAVC will be notifying all students, faculty and staff using a new emergency alert system called Blackboard Connect. This new system has the ability to let LAVC send emergency alert notifications simultaneously to students, staff and faculty by email, voice, and text message. However, students, faculty and staff must provide their cell phone number and/or personal email address (on the [LAVC Connect Portal](#)) before LAVC can send text and additional email alerts. *Please note: this portal is for emergency notifications only, and will not update any student and employee records with the LACCD.* A [How to Sign Up for Emergency Alerts from LA Valley College for Faculty/Staff](#) guide is available.
