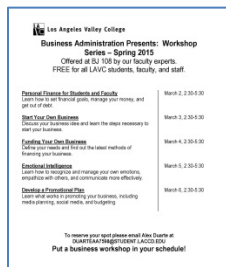

LAVC Students, Faculty and Staff Invited to Two Upcoming STARS Workshops – "Study Strategies" and "Overcoming Math Anxiety"

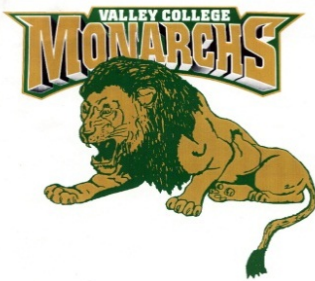

Need to Take the HiSET® (High School Equivalency Test)? LAVC to Offer the Computer-Based and the Paper-Based Test; Practice Test Also Offered

The LAVC CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) Program is now accepting registrations for the HiSET® (High School Equivalency Test). LAVC is an official HiSET testing site; the computer-based tests will be offered on Tuesday-Wednesday, March 3-4, and the paper-based test on Friday-Saturday, March 6-7. It will also offer the practice test on Friday, March 6; practice tests are also available by appointment. HiSET® is the new alternative to the GED. The CA State Board of Education approved the HiSET® for individuals to earn a California High School Equivalency Certificate. It is offered as a paper-based or computer-based test, and covers the following subject areas: Language Arts- Reading & Writing, Science, Social Studies and Mathematics. Both types of tests are offered on a regular basis. The fee for the full test is \$150.00 (non-refundable). The fee for the practice test is \$10. 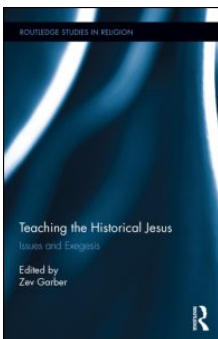
LAVC Welcomes Marco De La Garza, Dean of Student Success and Support Services

LAVC Professor Emeritus Reflects on Teaching Jewish Studies at LAVC in a Recently Published Book

Zev Garber, professor emeritus of Jewish Studies and adjunct faculty member in the Philosophy/Economic Department, recently published a book titled "Teaching the Historical Jesus:

Issues and Exegesis". Published as part of the Routledge Studies in Religion Series, this collection of essays explores the challenges of teaching the historical Jesus in a Jewish context. A diverse group of Jewish and Christian scholars reflect on their own classroom experiences. Attention Faculty & Staff! Have You Given LAVC Your Cell Phone and Alternate Email to Receive Emergency Notifications? LAVC is urging all LAVC faculty and staff to provide emergency contact information to Valley College through the new [LAVC Connect portal](#). During a campus emergency, LAVC will be notifying all students, faculty and staff using a new emergency alert system called Blackboard Connect. This new system has the ability to let LAVC send emergency alert notifications simultaneously to students, staff and faculty by email, voice, and text message.
