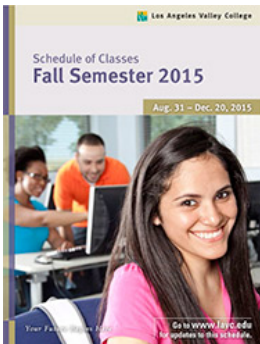

[TEMPORARY CHANGES IN VEHICULAR ACCESS TO THE CAMPUS DURING THE FIRST TWO WEEKS OF THE FALL SEMESTER](#)

From August 31-September 11, the College Sheriff will temporary close the main Fulton Avenue entrance (at Hatteras Street), and will have officers and cadets stationed at entrances of all student lots to help manage traffic and close full parking lots. The College Sheriff temporarily changes vehicular access to the campus and monitors campus parking lots to help ensure the safety of all students, faculty and

staff during the first two weeks of the semester. Please keep in mind the following when coming to the campus during these high traffic times of the school year:

- Vehicular access to the main Fulton Avenue entrance (roundabout) from Hatteras Street and Fulton Avenue will be closed.

- No left turns are allowed into campus parking lots from southbound lanes of Fulton Avenue and the eastbound lanes of Burbank Boulevard will be blocked.
- All students, faculty, staff and guests visiting the campus should plan to take a route to the campus that will enable them to make a right turn into the campus.
- The College Sheriff will have officers and cadets stationed at the entrance of all student parking lots (Lots A, B, C, D, F, G, L, M and the Parking Structure) from Monday-Thursday between 7 am-1 pm and 4-10 pm, to help direct traffic and close full parking lots.
- Staff parking in College Road North will only be accessible from the Fulton Avenue entrance to Lot B.
- Staff parking in College Road South will only be accessible from the Burbank Avenue entrance to Lot A.
- If a parking lot is closed, faculty/staff must show their valid Valley College parking permit to the officer or cadet stationed at the parking lot entrance.
- Access to the campus for Access Services Vehicles to the disabled student drop-off and pick-up location in the main entrance circle will only be available from the Fulton Avenue entrance to Lot A & B.
- All students will be given a two-week grace period for parking (in student lots only) during the beginning of the Fall Semester; however, students/guests parking in the faculty/staff parking areas, will be ticketed. Students are encouraged to purchase their parking permit from the [LAVC Business Office](#).
- The College Sheriff reminds everyone to obey traffic laws and drive safely. All legal violations will be enforced. Visit the [LAVC Campus Map](#) to view entrances to all parking areas.

The LAVC Art Gallery and the LAVC Art Department will present its Student Art Show 2015 from September 2-17 in the LAVC Art Gallery in the Art Building. This annual showcase highlights the tremendous range of artwork created by Los Angeles Valley College students during the 2014-2015 academic year. Juried by the art and photojournalism faculty, the selected works are among exemplary pieces produced in courses taught within the art department that span a wide range of disciplines in the visual arts such as drawing, painting, design, illustration, photography, printmaking, three-dimensional design, sculpture and ceramics. NEED TO TAKE THE HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVANCY TEST? LAVC OFFERS THE HISET TEST; PRACTICE TESTS ARE ALSO AVAILABLE

The LAVC CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids)

Office will be offering the paper-based HiSET® (High School Equivalency Test) on Friday-Saturday, September 18-19; the last day to register is September 9. In addition, the computer-based test will be offered by appointment only. It will offer the next HiSET practice test on Friday, September 4, and also by appointment. The HiSET is the new alternative to the GED; the CA State Board of Education approved the HiSET for individuals to earn a California High School Equivalency Certificate. To be eligible to take the HiSET, you must be a California resident, be 18 years or older, have a valid government issued identification, and not be currently enrolled in high school. The HiSET paper-based test will be held on Friday-Saturday, September 18 and 19 (must attend both days for each session); register by September 9 in Bungalow 14. The computer-based test is available by appointment only. The fee for the full test is \$150.00 and additional fees may apply (non-refundable). Space is limited and pre-registration is required. The HiSET practice test, which will give you an idea of how well you may score on the official HiSET test, are offered at 9 a.m. on designated Fridays (September 4, 11, 18, 25, October 2, 9, 16, 23, and 30) in Bungalow 14; check-in at 8:45 a.m. The practice test is also available by appointment. Dates are subject to change without notice. The fee for the test is \$10.00 (non-refundable). WELCOMING ROBERT TUCKER, LAVC'S NEW HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

The LAVC Athletics and Kinesiology Departments have recently hired Robert Tucker as the new full-time head football coach for the LAVC Monarchs Football Team. He is a Kinesiology instructor who will be teaching Kinesiology classes as part of his full-time faculty assignment. Tucker, who has a winning record of success—both domestically and internationally, comes to Valley College from West Hills College-Colinga. As its head football coach, he led the team to be the Northern California Football Conference's (NCFC) co-conference champs last year. His team, which had a 2-8 record the year prior to his arrival, held its best record in school history (10-1) and hosted the

college's first bowl game since 1982. For his efforts, Robert was named the Co-Coach of the Year. Most recently, Tucker was the defensive coordinator for the Team USA National Football Team, which took home the gold medal at the International Federation of American Football (IFAF) World Championship this summer. His prior football experience includes being the assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at the University of Sioux Falls, the director of football operations at the University of Colorado-Boulder, the defensive back coach and recruiting coordinator for Boise State University, and the teamwork coordinator for the University of Oregon. Tucker also served as the head coach for the Les Molosses D'Asnieres (American football) club, which was the vice-champions of France, and he was a defensive coordinator for the French national American football team in 2011. He holds a master's degree in physical education from Idaho State, and a bachelor's degree in psychology from Willamette University in Oregon.
