The LAVC Foundation is accepting Foundation scholarship applications from LAVC students. The application period for LAVC Foundation Scholarships began on Monday, January 25, and the deadline to submit an application for most scholarships is Friday, March 18.

To be eligible for a scholarship, the individual must be enrolled for the Spring 2016 semester at LA Valley College. Any student interested in these scholarships must stop by the LAVC Foundation Office and be prepared to answer questions (such as the Grade Point Average, the number of units that he/she have completed, units enrolled for Spring 2016, and the area of study) so that Foundation staff can assist in providing applications that the student may qualify for.

[DID YOU KNOW? LAVC HAS A CITIZENSHIP CENTER AND OFFERS ESL/CITIZENSHIP PREP CLASSES](#)

Los Angeles Valley College has a Citizenship Center which offers citizenship services to students and the community. It can offers assistance with citizenship forms, free E1 Civics/Citizenship test preparation classes, free ESL classes, referrals to legal entities, and study materials for the U.S. citizenship test.

During the Spring 2016 semester, the Citizenship Office will offer ESL/Citizenship Preparation classes. All interested individuals are welcome to receive assistance through the LAVC Citizenship Program. Services are available to LAVC students and anyone in the community who is interested in becoming a U.S. citizen.

The Citizenship Program at LAVC focuses on literacy skills and uses ESL methodologies to prepare learners to take and pass the United States Immigration and Naturalization Services (USCIS) test. The program includes outreach services, skills assessment, and naturalization preparation assistance. Program staff specialize in preparing various USCIS forms such as N-400, I-912, N-600, I-130, etc. Study materials approved by the USCIS are also available. The program is linked to ESL and Civics classes that discuss naturalization procedures, the rights and responsibilities of citizenship, and U.S. History and Government. LAVC ART GALLERY TO PRESENT MARA LONNER'S BURNOUTS; OPENING RECEPTION ON MARCH 17

The LAVC Art Gallery will present Burnouts, a solo exhibition by Los Angeles-based artist Mara Lonner from March 17-April 28. An opening reception for the artist will be held on Thursday, March 17 from 6-8 p.m. in the LAVC Art Gallery, which is located in the college's Art building. The exhibition and event is free to the public.

Lonner—with a lifelong interest in nature, architecture, and drawing—works with a variety of mediums, techniques, and genres. The artwork in *Burnouts* is no exception. The exhibition focuses on Lonner's recent series that employs the technique of drawing on black velvet, creating large-scale wall hangings that investigate the themes of loss and extinction. In addition, *Consequential Abstraction Series*, a tangential body of work was created while making the *Burnout Series*, is also featured.

The title of the exhibition refers to the burnout drawing process (also called *devoré*)—a technique in which Lonner applies by hand a chemical gel containing sodium hydrogen sulphate to a mixed-fiber material, thus dissolving away the cellulose-based fibers (rayon) and leaving behind the protein-based ones (silk). This results in a semi-transparent image against a more solidly woven fabric.

Lonner's subjects are methodically chosen from her collection of images culled from the Internet to convey a multiple of meanings. For example, one of the velvet drawings depicts the last known passenger pigeon, a female named Martha; she died at the Cincinnati Zoo, around September 1, 1914, and was roughly 29 years old. The image is a *momento mori*—a remainder of our morality. Moreover, it speaks poignantly about the destruction and slaughter of our natural resources by the hand of man.

As Lonner states: "When making the velvet drawings, a large amount of fugitive fibers are released and displaced throughout the studio. The Consequential Abstraction Series captures a portion of these process remnants on prepared paper mounted on panels. These panels are covered with objects found in and around the space where I am working. When the velvet drawing is completed, the objects are removed from the panels, and the fibers that remain are fixed to the surface. Material that could be lost is repurposed into another work as a consequence of the capture."

Lonner lives and works in Los Angeles. She received her BFA and MFA from the California Institute for the Arts, Valencia. Recent exhibitions include LAXART, Hollywood, California; Jancar Gallery, Los Angeles, and Cue Art Foundation, New York. The artist recently completed a large-scale, public art installation for the San Angelo Park community center in La Puente, California, commissioned by the Los Angeles County Arts Commission, and was awarded a project for the Intergenerational Center in the San Fernando Valley in which she collaborated with artist Kim Schoenstadt, commissioned by the Los Angeles Department of Cultural Affairs. Lonner is presently completing a glass pavilion for the Crenshaw/MLK station of the Metro's Crenshaw/LAX line.

WANT TO TAKE THE HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALANCY TEST? LAVC IS OFFERS THE HISET TEST AND PRACTICE TESTS

The LAVC Specialized Testing Center in conjunction with the CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) Office is now accepting registrations for the official High School Equivalency Test (or HiSET®), and the HiSET® Practice Test.

The HiSET® is the new alternative to the GED; the CA State Board of Education approved the HiSET® for individuals to earn a California High School Equivalency Certificate. To be eligible to take the HiSET®, you must be a California resident, be 18 years or older, have a valid government issued identification, and not be currently enrolled in high school.

LAVC is an official HiSET® Testing Site, and it offers the following:

- The HiSET® paper-based test is held monthly on a Friday and Saturday (participants must attend both days for each session). Registration is now open for the paper-based test that will be offered on Friday-Saturday, April 22 and 23; the last day to register is April 13 in Bungalow 14. The computer-based test is available by appointment only. The fee for the full test is \$150.00 and additional fees may apply (non-refundable). Space is limited and pre-registration is required.
- The HiSET® practice test will give you an idea of how well you may score on the official HiSET® test. The next available practice test will held on March 18 at 9 a.m. in Bungalow 14; registration is accepted on the day of the practice test. Practice tests are offered every Friday and by appointment. The fee for the test is \$10.00 (non-refundable).

Los Angeles Valley College was honored with 2015 Tree Campus USA® recognition by the Arbor Day Foundation for its commitment to effective urban forest management. Since 2011, LAVC has held the unique distinction of being the first and only California community college to be a Tree Campus USA®. In addition, Valley College was the first college campus in the city of Los Angeles to be bestowed this honorable designation in 2011.

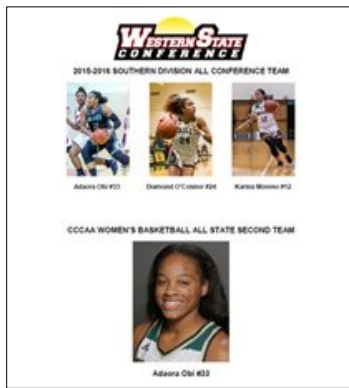
"Los Angeles Valley College is very proud to be named as a Tree Campus USA® for the fifth year in a row," said Dr. Erika Endrijonas, president of Los Angeles Valley College. "We thank the Arbor Day Foundation for recognizing our efforts to maintain our beautiful urban forest."

Los Angeles Valley College achieved the Tree Campus USA® designation by meeting the required five core standards for sustainable campus forestry: a tree advisory committee, a campus tree-care plan, dedicated annual expenditures for its campus tree program, an Arbor Day observance and the sponsorship of student service-learning projects.

LAVC's urban forest was established by early faculty members of the college's Biology department. Comprised of more than 1,600 of trees, LAVC has a diverse mixture of trees and plants that not only serves as an educational tool, but helps to inspire a college-wide commitment to sustainability. In addition, the college developed a Tree Master Plan to use as a guidebook for the future growth of its urban forest. Tree Campus USA® is a national program created in 2008 by the Arbor Day Foundation and to honor colleges and universities for effective campus forest management and for engaging staff and students in conservation goals. ATHLETICS UPDATE!—THREE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL PLAYERS NAMED TO 1ST TEAM ALL-CONFERENCE AND ONE NAMED TO ALL-STATE SECOND TEAM

The LAVC Athletics Program congratulates Andora Obi, Diamond O'Connor and Karina Moreno of Women's Basketball for being honored with first team All-Conference. In addition, Andora Obi was honored with the All-State second team. The following is an update on our Monarch Athletic teams:

- [Men's Basketball](#) ended its season with a win over Glendale (66-52). They got edged out of the Southern California Basketball playoffs and ended their season at 8-6 in the conference.
- The Lady Monarchs of [Women's Basketball](#) ended the conference season in second place. Following a win over Glendale (74-29) in its final game of the regular season, they lost to Orange Coast (61-63) in the first round of the regional playoffs. The team suffered injuries of several players this season, and despite these challenges played well against top teams in the state. Three players, Andora Obi, Diamond O'Connor and Karina Moreno, were honored with first team All-Conference, and Andora Obi was honored with All State second team. Andora, who signed to UCR, had 14 double doubles this year. During Andora's two years at LAVC, she has had 32 double doubles and scored 845 points. Karina, who is going to CSULA, was tied for #1 assist per game in the state. Diamond is a freshman and will be back next year. Diamond had 16 double doubles.
- [Baseball](#) has a overall record of 8-6. The team had 2 out of 3 wins over Folsom Lake (5-4, 2-0, 5-7) before losing to 1 out of 2 games against Irvine Valley (3-4, 5-3). It beat Pasadena (4-3) and had a victory at West LA (13-4). The team will continue its 3-part series play West LA at home on March 10 and then at West LA on March 12. It will then go head-to-head against College of the Canyons on March 15, 17, and 18; both the March 15 game at 2 p.m. and the March 18 game at 2:30 p.m. will be played on the LAVC Softball field.
- Women's [Softball](#) is 3-7 in the pre-conference play. Its game against Long Beach was halted due to rain, then then it lost to Allen Hancock (3-8) and Ventura (6-7 in 10 innings). The Lady Monarchs triumphed against Oxnard (13-1 in 5 innings) before ending the week with a lost to Moorpark (1-5). Next up, they will play at Santa Ana on March 14 and at Santa Monica on March 15 before heading home to go up against Antelope Valley on March 17 at 2:30 p.m. in the Softball field. Then, it will head off to the Santa Barbara tournament on March 19-20.
- [Men's Swimming and Diving](#) completed well at the Golden West tournament. At its first Western State Conference (WSC) meet at Pierce, swimming beat Citrus, Bakersfield, Hancock and Pierce. Next week is the WSC #2 swim meet on March 19 at Santa Monica, and the WSC #3 dive meet on March 19 at Ventura.
- [Women's Swimming and Diving](#) also competed well at the Golden West tournament and WSC #1 meet at Pierce. Next up is the WSC #2 swim meet on March 19 at Santa Monica.

The LAVC Athletics Department's Monarch Athletics program comprises of 10 intercollegiate athletic teams. The Men's Football, Women's Soccer, and Men and Women's Water Polo teams play every fall. Spring team sports include Men's Baseball, Men's and Women's Basketball, Women's Softball, and Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving. After 2 contested elections, L.A. Community College District may finally have a tech fix

Following two contested student trustee elections, Los Angeles Community College District has agreed to spend nearly \$25,000 on a one-year contract with Votenet, a Washington, D.C., company that makes electronic voting systems. Students will have to enter their district-issued identification number before they cast a ballot on a computer, so they can vote only once. The new system will be in place for the next student election in late April. Previously, votes for the student trustee were counted by district officials by hand.
