[DON'T MISS THE ART GALLERY'S "BURNOUTS" EXHIBITION; NEW ART GALLERY HOURS](#)

*The LAVC Art Gallery will present **Burnouts**, a solo exhibition by Los Angeles-based artist Mara Lonner from March 17-April 28. Starting March 21, the exhibit will be open Monday-Thursday from 1-4 p.m., and 6-9 p.m. in the LAVC Art Gallery in the Art building. The exhibition is free to the public.*

Lonner—with a lifelong interest in nature, architecture, and drawing—works with a variety of mediums, techniques, and genres. The artwork in *Burnouts* is no exception. The exhibition focuses on Lonner's recent series that employs the technique of drawing on black velvet, creating large-scale wall hangings that investigate the themes of loss and extinction. In addition, *Consequential Abstraction Series*, a tangential body of work was created while making the *Burnout Series*, is also featured.

The title of the exhibition refers to the burnout drawing process (also called *devoré*)—a technique in which Lonner applies by hand a chemical gel containing sodium hydrogen sulphate to a mixed-fiber material, thus dissolving away the cellulose-based fibers (rayon) and leaving behind the protein-based ones (silk). This results in a semi-transparent image against a more solidly woven fabric.

Lonner's subjects are methodically chosen from her collection of images culled from the Internet to convey a multiple of meanings. For example, one of the velvet drawings depicts the last known passenger pigeon, a female named Martha; she died at the Cincinnati Zoo, around September 1, 1914, and was roughly 29 years old. The image is a *momento mori*—a remainder of our morality. Moreover, it speaks poignantly about the destruction and slaughter of our natural resources by the hand of man.

As Lonner states: "When making the velvet drawings, a large amount of fugitive fibers are released and displaced throughout the studio. The *Consequential Abstraction Series* captures a portion of these process remnants on prepared paper mounted on panels. These panels are covered with objects found in and around the space where I am working. When the velvet drawing is completed, the objects are removed from the panels, and the fibers that remain are fixed to the surface. Material that could be lost is repurposed into another work as a consequence of the capture."

Lonner lives and works in Los Angeles. She received her BFA and MFA from the California Institute for the Arts, Valencia. Recent exhibitions include LAXART, Hollywood, California; Jancar Gallery, Los Angeles, and Cue Art Foundation, New York. The artist recently completed a large-scale, public art installation for the San Angelo Park community center in La Puente, California, commissioned by the Los Angeles County Arts Commission, and was awarded a project for the Intergenerational Center in the San Fernando Valley in which she collaborated with

artist Kim Schoenstadt, commissioned by the Los Angeles Department of Cultural Affairs. Lonner is presently completing a glass pavilion for the Crenshaw/MLK station of the Metro's Crenshaw/LAX line.

The exhibit is open during the Art Gallery's regular hours of operation; starting March 21, its hours will be Monday-Thursday from 1-4 p.m., and 6-9 p.m. Please note: the Art Gallery will be closed during the week of Spring Break from March 31 to April 8, 2016. DON'T MISS LAVC THEATER ART'S PRODUCTION OF THE LARAMIE PROJECT ON MARCH 23-26!

The LAVC Theater Art Department and the Valley Collegiate Players will present The Laramie Project by Moises Kaufman and the Tectonic Theater Project on Wednesday-Saturday, March 23-26; evening performances will be

held at 8 p.m. with an additional Saturday matinee at 2 p.m. in the LAVC Horseshoe Theater. In October 1998, Matthew Shepard was kidnapped, severely beaten and left to die, tied to a fence on the outskirts of Laramie, Wyoming. Five weeks later, Moisés Kaufman and fellow members of the Tectonic Theater Project went to Laramie, and over the course of the next year, conducted more than 200 interviews with people of the town. From these interviews they wrote the play *The Laramie Project*, a chronicle of the life of the town of Laramie in the year after the murder. *The Laramie Project* is one of the most performed plays in America today. This is a Valley Collegiate Players production, which is entirely produced, directed, designed, managed, staffed and performed by students in the LAVC Theater Arts Department. It is directed by Katherine Arevalo with scenic design by Antonio Cruz-Ventura, costume design by Kamille Bennett, and lighting design by Steven Montoya. BE A PART OF LAVCS URBAN FOREST PROJECT ON MARCH 25!

The LAVC Sustainability Committee, ASU Eco Advocates, Tree People and Trader Joes is holding a "Urban Forest Project: Tree Care and Tree Mapping Event" on Friday, March 25 from 9 a.m.-12 p.m. at the traffic circle at LAVC's Fulton Avenue main entrance. This Urban Forest Project: Tree Care and Mapping event, which is open to all students (especially those with an interest in biology, geography or environmental science) and the public, will help nurture and appreciate our local urban forest. With the help of TreePeople, a local tree organization, participants will add mulch to trees, water the trees, adjust the berms, and prune the leaves on campus. In addition, participants will get the opportunity to survey a field and experience hands-on environmental fieldwork. Participants will be able to register tree information via the TreeMapLA application for smartphones, which is similar to GPS and GIS, but for trees. After collecting tree data, the app measures environmental benefits that the tree provides, such as monetary savings, water conservation and improved air quality. The tree

mapping process allows tree mappers to create powerful digital tool to help the public learn more about our urban forest and its value! LAVC IS A HISET TESTING SITE! REGISTER FOR THE HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY TEST OR PRACTICE TEST

The LAVC Specialized Testing Center in conjunction with the CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) Office is now accepting registrations for the official High School Equivalency Test (or HiSET®), and the HiSET® Practice Test. The HiSET® is the new alternative to the GED; the CA State Board of Education approved the HiSET® for individuals to earn a California High School Equivalency Certificate. To be eligible to take the HiSET®, you must be a California resident, be 18 years or older, have a valid government issued identification, and not be currently enrolled in high school. LAVC is an official HiSET® Testing Site, and it offers the following:

- The HiSET® paper-based test is held monthly on a Friday and Saturday (participants must attend both days for each session). Registration is now open for the paper-based test that will be offered on Friday-Saturday, April 22 and 23; the last day to register is April 13 in Bungalow 14. The computer-based test is available by appointment only. The fee for the full test is \$150.00 and additional fees may apply (non-refundable). Space is limited and pre-registration is required.
- The HiSET® practice test will give you an idea of how well you may score on the official HiSET® test. The next available practice test will held on Friday, March 25 at 9 a.m. in Bungalow 14; registration is accepted on the day of the practice test. Practice tests are offered every Friday and by appointment. The fee for the test is \$10.00 (non-refundable).

CONGRATULATIONS TO LAVC SPEECH & DEBATE—TEAM WINS AT STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS!

The LAVC Speech and Debate Team completed against 31 schools at the California Community College Forensics Association (CCCFA) Speech and Debate Championships on March 9-13, 2016 at City College of San Francisco in Concord, California. The team of 15 members returned home with 6 Gold, 10 Silver, and 6 Bronze Medals from the statewide competition for California community college students. The team is coached by Kevin Briancesco, Allison Bowman, and Jimmy Gomez.

Students Abdullah Salehuddin, Dominique Bautista, Evan Feldman, Joseph Vaysman, Natalia Ramos were the state-champions in their respective events. Second-year student Evan Feldman, had a particularly good weekend—to put it mildly—with 2 gold, 1 silver, and 1 bronze medals and is on his way to winning the Tabor/Collins Award, which is given to the top speaker in the state of California. Overall, the team was honored as the 4th best overall program in the entire state of California. It should be noted that the success of Valley's students is especially impressive when considering the disparity of budgetary and coaching resources between Valley and its top competition at other colleges.
