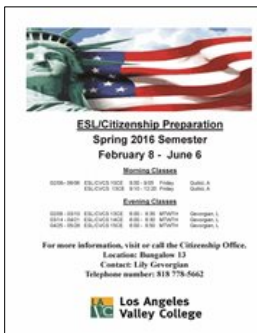


[LAST CHANCE TO SEE MARA LONNER'S BURNOUTS EXHIBIT! EXHIBIT ENDS APRIL 28](#)

Los Angeles Valley College will present Burnouts, a solo exhibition by Los Angeles-based artist Mara Lonner from March 17-30 and April 11-28 in the LAVC Art Gallery in the Art building. The exhibit is open Monday-Thursday from 1-4 p.m.,

and 6-9 p.m. Lonner—with a lifelong interest in nature, architecture, and drawing—works with a variety of mediums, techniques, and genres. The artwork in Burnouts is no exception. The exhibition focuses on Lonner's recent series that employs the technique of drawing on black velvet, creating large-scale wall hangings that investigate the themes of loss and extinction. In addition, Consequential Abstraction Series, a tangential body of work was created while making the Burnout Series, is also featured.

The title of the exhibition refers to the burnout drawing process (also called devoré)—a technique in which Lonner applies by hand a chemical gel containing sodium hydrogen sulphate to a mixed-fiber material, thus dissolving away the cellulose-based fibers (rayon) and leaving behind the protein-based ones (silk). This results in a semi-transparent image against a more solidly woven fabric. Parking permits are required during regular gallery hours; a daily parking permit can be purchased at parking pay stations in Parking Lot D or the Parking Structure. [View map](#). Los Angeles Valley College has a Citizenship Center which offers citizenship services to students and the community. It can offers assistance with citizenship forms, free E1 Civics/Citizenship test preparation classes, free ESL classes, referrals to legal entities, and study materials for the U.S. citizenship test.

All interested individuals are welcome to receive assistance through the LAVC Citizenship Program. Services are available to LAVC students and anyone in the community who is interested in becoming a U.S. citizen. The Citizenship Program at LAVC focuses on literacy skills and uses ESL methodologies to prepare learners to take and pass the United States Immigration and Naturalization Services (USCIS) test. The program includes

outreach services, skills assessment, and naturalization preparation assistance. Program staff specialize in preparing various USCIS forms such as N-400, I-912, N-600, I-130, etc. Study materials approved by the USCIS are also available. The program is linked to ESL and Civics classes that discuss naturalization procedures, the rights and responsibilities of citizenship, and U.S. History and Government. [PLANNING TO TAKE THE HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALANCY TEST? LAVC OFFERS THE HISET TEST AND PRACTICE TESTS](#)

The LAVC Specialized Testing Center in conjunction with the CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) Office is now accepting registrations for the official High School Equivalency Test (or HiSET®), and the HiSET® Practice Test.

The HiSET® is the new alternative to the GED; the CA State Board of Education approved the HiSET® for individuals to earn a California High School Equivalency Certificate. To be eligible to take the HiSET®, you must be a California resident, be 18 years or older, have a valid government issued identification, and not be currently enrolled in high school.

LAVC is an official HiSET® Testing Site, and it offers the following:

- The HiSET® paper-based test is held monthly on a Friday and Saturday (participants must attend both days for each session). Registration is now open for the paper-based test that will be offered on Friday-Saturday, May 13-14; the last day to register is May 4 in Bungalow 14. The computer-based test is available by appointment only. The fee for the full test is \$150.00 and additional fees may apply (non-refundable). Space is limited and pre-registration is required.
- The HiSET® practice test will give you an idea of how well you may score on the official HiSET® test. The next available practice test will held on Friday, April 29 at 9 a.m. in Bungalow 14; registration is accepted on the day of the practice test. Practice tests are offered Fridays and by appointment. The fee for the test is \$10.00 (non-refundable).

ATHLETICS UPDATE—SWIMMING HEADS TO THE WSC CHAMPIONSHIPS; COME CHEER ON BASEBALL AT A HOME GAME!

The LAVC Athletics Department congratulates the men's and women's swimming team for making it to the Western State Conference (WSC) championship. It also congratulates Baseball for its wins over Citrus, Antelope Valley, and Glendale, and to Softball for beating Citrus, LA Mission, Santa Monica and Bakerfield.

The campus community is invited to cheer on the Baseball at its upcoming home games on Tuesday, April 26 at 2:30 p.m. and Friday, April 29 at 2:30 p.m. in the Baseball field.

The following is an update on our Monarch Athletic teams:

- [Baseball](#) has a 17-14 overall record. They went 2-1 in its three-game series against Citrus (12-1, 6-1, 4-6) before sweeping Antelope Valley (4-1, 3-2, 10-0). The team won one game in its series with Glendale (0-6, 5-4 in 10 innings, 2-7), and then lost to Bakersfield (0-7) in game one of a three-series. For the week of April 24-30, Baseball will play LA Mission on April 26 at home, on April 28 at Mission, and April 26 at home; all home games are played on the LAVC Baseball field.
- [Softball](#) is 10-8 in conference play. They played Citrus (1-7, 8-9), before losing to College of the Canyons (3-4). The team is 1-1 at its double header with LA Mission (1-3; 2-0), and beat Santa Monica (16-0 in 5 innings) before losing at Antelope Valley (4-8, 3-4). It beat Glendale (12-6), and then were 1-1 at the Bakersfield double header (1-0 in 8 innings, 6-9 in 9 innings). At its last game, it beat Citrus (3-2). Its final two games of the conference will be a double header at College of the Canyons on April 26.
- [Men's Swimming and Diving](#) and the [Women's Swimming and Diving](#) have had a successful season. Both teams will play in the WSC Championships at Cuesta on April 21-23.

The LAVC Athletics Department's Monarch Athletics program comprises of 10 intercollegiate athletic teams. The Men's Football, Women's Soccer, and Men and Women's Water Polo teams play every fall. Spring team sports include Men's Baseball, Men's and Women's Basketball, Women's Softball, and Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving. GRANTS UPDATE—LAVC TO RECEIVE GRANT TO IMPROVE ITS FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE PROGRAM

The LAVC Grants Committee announced that the college has received approximately a \$1.5 million Basic Skills Transformation grant from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office (CCCCO) for the 2016-2019 year. LAVC will use the grant funds to develop and scale its existing First Year Experience program called the START Program into a more comprehensive program that incorporates

accelerated math and English pathways, embedded tutoring, and the one book one campus initiative. The grant plans to scale the program to 1,800 students.

Through this grant, LAVC will design clear pathways with comprehensive wrap around services to help ensure that entering students, especially those placed in to the basic skills math and English sequences, earn degrees and certificates within two years. It will develop two- and three-course sequences (as appropriate) for completion of a college-level English and/or mathematics course for under prepared students through the use of technology. In addition, it will align content in remedial courses with students' intended course of study to better target the students' actual needs and to increase relevance. Lastly, it will provide proactive student support services that are integrated with the instruction.

The Title V Cooperative Project, which is funded by the US Department of Education's Postsecondary H.S.I Title V Cooperative, is a joint partnership with LAVC, East Los Angeles College (ELAC) and Los Angeles Trade-Tech College (LATTTC). The grant will have three activity areas including faculty development (LAVC lead), adaptive course learning projects (ELAC & LATTTC lead) and one stop student support (ELAC). Dr. Deborah diCesare, dean of academic affairs, is the project director of Valley College's Cooperative Title V Project, Sorangel Hernandez, Title V Cooperative Program Director at Los Angeles Valley College.
