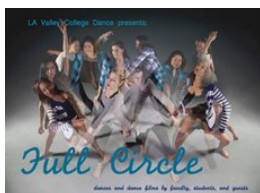

PLANNING TO TAKE THE HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALANCY TEST? LAVC OFFERS THE HISET AND HISET PRACTICE TESTS

The LAVC Specialized Testing Center in conjunction with the CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) Office is now accepting registrations for the official High School Equivalency Test (or HiSET®), and the HiSET® Practice Test. The HiSET® is the new alternative to the GED; the CA State Board of Education approved the HiSET® for individuals to earn a California High School Equivalency Certificate. To be eligible to take the HiSET®, you must be a California resident, be 18 years or older, have a valid government issued identification, and not be currently enrolled in high school.

LAVC is an official HiSET® Testing Site, and it offers the following:

- The HiSET® computer-based test is available by appointment only. The fee for the full test is \$150.00 and additional fees may apply (non-refundable). Space is limited and pre-registration is required.
- The HiSET® practice test will give you an idea of how well you may score on the official HiSET® test. The next available practice test will held on Friday, May 13 at 9 a.m. in Bungalow 14; registration is accepted on the day of the practice test. Practice tests are offered Fridays and by appointment. The fee for the test is \$10.00 (non-refundable).

INTRODUCING BANK MOBILE VIBE! HIGHER ONE ACCOUNTS WILL BECOME BANK MOBILE VIBE ON JUNE 1

The Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD) announced that all Higher One accounts used for financial aid disbursements will become Bank Mobile Vibe effective on June 1, 2016. As part of the transition, the Higher One ATMs on campus have been placed out of service, and you can now get cash for no fee from any Allpoint ATM.

More choices. Less fees.

That's what students can expect to see from their financial aid disbursements beginning next month. A new vendor, Bank Mobile Vibe, reduces or eliminates several fees students were charged with their former account.

These changes do not impact the account balance, **will not change the PIN number**, or require any action from students.

Here are the key points students need to know:

- All Higher One accounts becomes Bank Mobile Vibe on June 1, 2016
- There will be no change in the account number
- Students **do not need** to get a new bank card
- Students will be able to access cash from more locations **off campus without paying a fee**. The number of fee-free ATM locations increases to 55,000 nationwide.
- Greater access to the money means that students will no longer have to go to campus to withdraw cash or pay fees at many ATMs
- A new ATM will be installed on each campus by that students can draw funds from.

The new Bank Mobile Vibe will cost students less for many transactions. Below is the new fee structure:

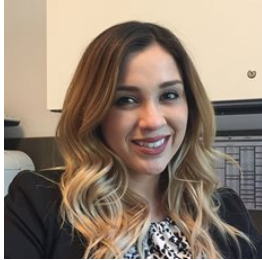
Please note: On May 4, 2016, the Higher One ATMs on campus were removed from service as part of the transition to a new vendor. Students who wish to withdrawal money from their myLACCD Card from Higher One, will be able to do so without a surcharge at any Allpoint ATM in the city.

As of May 4, 2016, students will have access to thousands of fee-free Allpoint ATMs nationwide. To find a nearby surcharge-free ATM:

A WARM WELCOME TO SORANGEL HERNANDEZ—TITLE V COOPERATIVE PROGRAM DIRECTOR

The LAVC Academic Affairs Office welcomes Sorangel Hernandez as its new Title V Cooperative Program Director. Under the supervision of Dr. Deborah diCesare, she will be responsible for overseeing a new three-campus cooperative program with LAVC, East Los Angeles College (ELAC), and Los Angeles Trade Technical College (LATTC), which is funded by a grant from the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Postsecondary Education H.S.I. Title V Cooperative.

The Title V Cooperative Program will develop activities that address low progress rates, low persistence and low completion rates of students by focusing on the following three areas: faculty development, adaptive course learning and a one-stop student support. Sorangel's duties include managing the budget, program activities, and the overall implementation of the program.

LAVC is taking the lead on the area of faculty development, and Sorangel is currently recruiting faculty to participate in a teaching innovation academy for instructors who teach students who are at-risk of failing or repeating "gateway" course. This two-week academy will focus on learning ways to increase retention and success in high-demand, low-success courses, and then redesigning the classes and piloting them in the Fall 2016 semester. Interested faculty members should contact Sorangel to find out how to participate.

Sorangel will also oversee the adaptive learning components being lead at ELAC and LATTC. These components will explore technology-blended learning environments for students, that adapt to the learning style of the student to improve student engagement. In addition, the program will observe ELAC's one stop student support component.

In addition, Sorangel will work with the LAVC, ELAC and LATTC foundations on the Endowment Match component of the grant to help sustain the program after the grant ends. The grant will match up to \$20,000 each year, from each college, for up to five years.

She has worked in the LACCD since 2005. Prior to arriving at LAVC, Sorangel was at the LACCD CalWORKs coordinator for all nine colleges in the District. She also worked at before becoming a Specially Funding Program specialist/coordinator over the career technical education, contract education, and an industry-driven cooperative at Harbor College.

A graduate of East Los Angeles College, she holds her bachelor's degree in criminology, law and society from UC Irvine, her master's in public policy from USC, and is currently earning her doctorate in educational leadership from USC.

[MICHELLE LEWIS TO COORDINATE LAVC'S ONE BOOK, ONE COLLEGE PROGRAM](#)

Michelle Lewis, chair of LAVC's History, Humanities, Law and Political Science Department, has been selected as the program coordinator for LAVC's new One Book, One College program. She will assume this role on June 1, 2016. The One Book, One College program, which is a successful concept that has been implemented at other colleges and universities, will be one book that faculty from variety of disciplines will be able to incorporate into their teaching during Fall 2016 and Spring

2017. This program will show students how different disciplines can be connected by the same reading material, and will help to create intellectual continuity and shared experiences for LAVC students and faculty.

The college is currently seeking input from faculty on which one of the following two book to use for the 2016-2017 academic year:

- **[The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks](#)**: Her name was Henrietta Lacks, but scientists know her as HeLa. She was a poor black tobacco farmer whose cells—taken without her knowledge in 1951—became one of the most important tools in medicine, vital for developing the polio vaccine, cloning, gene mapping, and more. Henrietta's cells have been bought and sold by the billions, yet she remains virtually unknown, and her family can't afford health insurance. This phenomenal New York Times bestseller tells a riveting story of the collision between ethics, race, and medicine; of scientific discovery and faith healing; and of a daughter consumed with questions about the mother she never knew. http://www.nytimes.com/2010/02/07/books/review/Margonelli-t.html?pagewanted=all&_r=1
- **[Southland](#)**: Spanning three generations, Revoyr's follow-up to *The Necessary Hunger* (1997) uses the murder of three boys during the 1965 Watts riot as the pivot point for a moving, sometimes harrowing exploration of race relations among black, Japanese, and white residents of L.A. When her grandfather dies in 1994, young Japanese American lawyer Jackie Ishida seeks to discover why her grandfather, Frank, had once planned to leave his Crenshaw grocery store to one of the murder victims, a black teen from the neighborhood. After enlisting the help of one of the young man's relatives, rock-solid community group worker James Lanier, Jackie embarks on a journey that will enable her to understand why she has fled so far from her Japanese roots she won't even consider dating a fellow Asian. Switching effortlessly from the mid-1990s to the 1960s, the 1940s, and back again, Revoyr peoples the landscape with compelling characters who are equally believable whether they're black, Japanese, male, female, gay, or straight. With prose that is beautiful, precise, but never pretentious, she brings to vivid life a painful, seldom-explored part of L.A.'s past that should not be forgotten. <http://www.publishersweekly.com/978-1-888451-41-2>

The selected book will be announced before the end of Spring 2016, so it can be used starting in Fall 2016. Over the summer, there will be a faculty book club (virtual and in-person) to enable faculty to work through the book together and brainstorm about how to incorporate the book into their curriculum. In addition, there will campus events related to the book held in the late Fall and Spring semesters.

"I am very excited to be involved and to help spearhead this program at Valley College," said Michelle Lewis. "I heard about similar programs at other colleges about five years ago, so I am enthusiastic that it has come to Valley. I look forward to working with all faculty in a diverse array of academic disciplines."

Michelle is an associate professor of history, and also serves as the faculty adviser for Tau Alpha Epsilon and Phi Theta Kappa at LAVC.

She is proud that she comes from a community college family; her father is a retired professor of biology, her sister teaches chemistry at a community college and she has been teaching at LAVC for 10 years. A graduate of Orange Coast College, she transferred to UCLA to earn her bachelor's degree in history. She also holds a master's degree in history from UC Riverside.

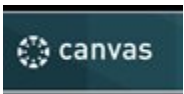
