[LAVC OFFERING FALL 2016 LATE-START CLASSES; IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO REGISTER](#)

The LAVC Academic Affairs Office is offering more than 100 late-start class sections for the Fall 2016 semester to help students complete their degree, transfer sooner and/or reach their academic goals. These short-term class sections, which start later in the semester (or "late-start"), include a wide selection of high-demand UC/CSU-transferrable courses offered on-campus, off-campus, and online.

Late-start classes are offered in 29 disciplines including Accounting, Anthropology, Art, Business, Computer Applications and Office Technologies, Child Development, Communications, Counseling, English, ESL, Health, History, Math, Math, Political Science, Sociology, ESL Civics, and more.

[ATHLETICS UPDATE—BACK-TO-BACK WINS FOR FOOTBALL AND WOMEN'S WATER POLO](#)

The LAVC Athletics Department congratulates the Men's Football team for its win over College of the Desert and Women's Water Polo for beating Pasadena, San Diego Miramar, and Santa Monica. Both teams have an undefeated record this season.

LAVC students, faculty and staff are invited to cheer on the Monarchs at the Women's Soccer home game on Friday, September 23 at 7 p.m. in Monarch Stadium, and the Hall of Fame Game for Men's Football on Saturday, September 24 at 7 p.m.

The following is an update on our Monarch Athletic teams:

- [Men's Football](#) keeps its undefeated record with a win against College of the Desert (23-14). The next game will be played against Glendale College at home on September 24 at 7 p.m. at Monarch Stadium; this is the Hall of Fame Game, so there is a [LAVC Hall of Fame BBQ](#) scheduled before the game, and Hall of Fame members will also be recognized at the half-time of the game. Tickets are \$7 for adults and \$4 for students.
- [Men's Water Polo](#) tied with Palomar (0-0) and lost to Golden West at the Golden West tournament. They also lost at their game against Cerritos (15). The team will next play at the Cuesta tournament on September 22-24 at Cuesta.
- [Women's Soccer](#) had disappointing losses to San Diego Mesa (1-4) and Grossmont (0-1), but tied with Antelope Valley (0-0). Next, it will play at College of the Canyons on September 20. The next home game will be versus Moorpark on September 23 at 7 p.m. in the Monarch Stadium; admission is free.
- [Women's Water Polo](#) won their first three games of season play. It beat Pasadena City (8-1) and San Diego Miramar (8-4) at the LAVC mini tournament, and triumphed over Santa Monica (19-3) at its inaugural game of the Western State Conference. Coming up, it will play at Hancock on September 21 and at the Mt. San Antonio College tournament on September 23-24.

The LAVC Athletics Department's Monarch Athletics program comprises of 10 intercollegiate athletic teams. The Men's Football, Women's Soccer, and Men and Women's Water Polo teams play every fall. Spring team sports include Men's Baseball, Men's and Women's Basketball, Women's Softball, and Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving. [L.A.'S "COLLEGE PROMISE" HIGHLIGHTED AS AN EXAMPLE FOR THE NATION](#)

Underscoring the value of higher education and applauding a bold initiative to support one of the nation's highest concentrations of low-income students, Jill Biden, Ed.D., Second Lady of the United States, joined local officials to launch the Los Angeles College Promise – a program that provides one year of free enrollment to any of the nine colleges within the Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD).

"We are delighted to have Dr. Biden join us as we launch one of the most important education initiatives in the history of Los Angeles," said Scott J. Svonkin, President of the LACCD Board of Trustees. "The LACCD Board of Trustees committed to President Obama's 'America's College Promise' when we heard of his initiative. We are the nation's largest community college district and proud to create a 'Promise' program as President Obama envisioned."

President Obama appointed Dr. Biden as the honorary chair of his College Promise Advisory Board, a group working to influence the nation's citizenry and elected leaders about the need to provide free community college

education to all. Dr. Biden is an English teacher at a community college in Virginia in addition to her work as the nation's second lady. Svonkin was appointed by President Obama and is the only elected community college leader in the nation appointed to the College Promise National Advisory Board.

The Los Angeles College Promise will provide one year of free enrollment to all full-time (12 units) qualifying students graduating from LAUSD and charter high schools starting with seniors graduating in 2017. Included in this program are priority enrollment, placement in math and English courses required to succeed in college and career support and counseling. The program's goal is to increase the number of community college graduates, university transfers, and workforce-ready students.

Surrounded by cheering Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) high school students and LACCD students, Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti announced the new program to an enthusiastic crowd of educators, business and civic leaders at Los Angeles City College, one of LACCD's nine colleges.

"Higher education should be within reach for every student in Los Angeles. The L.A. College Promise is a path for every Angeleno to earn a high school diploma and pursue the skills and education they need to realize their dreams and potential," said Mayor Garcetti. "When the first Promise students step onto campus next fall, they'll be doing more than putting themselves on a launching pad to prosperity — they'll embody a commitment that is fundamental to who we are as a people, and what we want for our future."

"Community colleges don't just create pathways of success, they do so for some of our most underserved populations, which amplifies their positive impact," said LACCD Chancellor Francisco C. Rodriguez, Ph.D. "So many LAUSD students feel college is simply not an option. But by making community colleges tuition-free for the first year, the Los Angeles College Promise will ensure students have a real opportunity for higher education at a time when it's more essential than ever to have a college degree or certification to be competitive in today's job market."

The nine colleges of the LACCD comprise the nation's largest community college district, with an annual enrollment of nearly a quarter million. Eighty percent of LACCD students are from underserved populations, more than half are older than 25 years of age, and more than a quarter are 35 or older.

"It's easy for new high school graduates to get caught up in living paycheck to paycheck right after graduation, rather than pursuing an education that may lead to middle class or better career opportunities," said Bryant Woodert, who grew up in Watts and is a student at Los Angeles City College. "The L.A. College Promise would give more LAUSD students an immediate pathway to college, setting them on the right track to the middle class or better before they get sidetracked."

LACCD colleges have an impressive record of success. More than two-thirds of its students successfully complete their credit courses, with almost 15,000 students annually earning an associate's degree or certificate and 5,700 students transferring to a UC or CSU campus every year.

Los Angeles Community College District comprises of nine college campuses including East Los Angeles College, Los Angeles City College, Los Angeles Harbor College, Los Angeles Southwest College, Los Angeles Trade-Technical College, Los Angeles Pierce College, Los Angeles Mission College, Los Angeles Valley College, and West Los Angeles College.

"The Los Angeles Community College District is working with the business community to join us and support our high school students and all area residents who want to challenge themselves or enhance their career objectives with additional training," said Svonkin. "LACCD supports the educational aspirations of students of all ages."

The Los Angeles College Promise benefits the city and region by creating a college-going culture and responding to the workforce readiness gap in California. The Los Angeles College Promise is a partnership among Mayor Garcetti's "Mayor's Fund," LAUSD, LACCD and the LA Area Chamber of Commerce. [Read the LACCD press release.](#)



[LA HARBOR COLLEGE TO SHOWCASE PROFESSOR EMERITUS DENNIS REED'S ARTWORK](#)

Dennis Reed, professor emeritus of art at LAVC, along with artist Merwin Belin will have their artwork showcased at an "ALLEGORY for the Present: Merwin Belin & Dennis Reed" exhibition from September 24-November 5 at the Fine Arts Gallery of Los Angeles Harbor College (LAHC). The exhibition will open with an Artists' Reception on Saturday, September 24 from 4-7 p.m. at LAHC.

Merwin Belin has been producing provocations in one form or another since the early 1970's, embracing a strategy first described as *detournement* by Guy Debord and Gil J. Wolman in 1956, and later employed as a part of the Situationist International's openly declared war on the 'Society of the Spectacle'. The two fundamental laws of detournement are the loss of importance of each detoured autonomous element - which may go so far as to completely lose its original sense - and at the same time the organization of another meaningful ensemble that confers on each element its new scope and effect. From reconstructed newspaper front pages to text/image reassignments to impoverished original assemblages, his work is consistently witty, irreverent, spare, and often elegant.

Dennis Reed's images are excerpted from a decades-long photographic project that took its momentum at the beginning of the Iraq War and extended beyond, capturing television screen images of random acts of violence, accidents and crime scenes, as well as innocuous entertainment programs. The medium is the message, or an elemental part thereof, in an enterprise the artist describes as unanticipated and unpredictable. In preparation for a book version of the TV Series images, Reed explained that he added text gleaned from newspaper obituaries and matched to the dark emotional tone of the images. Phrases were divided into three lines, and poems constructed using five of the phrases, relying on rhythm rather than rhyme.

KNOW SOMEONE WHO NEEDS TO TAKE THE HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY TEST? LAVC OFFERS THE HISET TESTING OR PRACTICE

TEST

The LAVC Specialized Testing Center in conjunction with the CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) Office is now accepting registrations for the official High School Equivalency Test (or HiSET®), and the HiSET® Practice Test.

The HiSET® is the new alternative to the GED; the CA State Board of Education approved the HiSET® for individuals to earn a California High School Equivalency Certificate. To be eligible to take the HiSET®, you must be a California resident, be 18 years or older, have a valid government issued identification, and not be currently enrolled in high school.

LAVC is an official HiSET® Testing Site, and it offers the following:

- The HiSET® paper-based test is held monthly on a Friday and Saturday (participants must attend both days for each session). Registration is now open for the paper-based test that will be offered on Friday-Saturday, October 14 and 15; the last day to register is October 5 in Bungalow 14. The computer-based test is available by appointment only. The fee for the full test is \$150.00 and additional fees may apply (non-refundable). Space is limited and pre-registration is required.
- The HiSET® practice test will give you an idea of how well you may score on the official HiSET® test. The next available practice test will be held on Friday, September 16 at 9 a.m. in Bungalow 14; registration is accepted on the day of the practice test. Practice tests are offered every Friday and by appointment. The fee for the test is \$10.00 (non-refundable).
