[LAVC ALUMNA ANDRA HOFFMAN ELECTED TO THE CA COMMUNITY COLLEGE TRUSTEES BOARD](#)

Congratulations to LACCD Board Member and LAVC alumna Andra Hoffman who was recently elected to serve on the Board of California Community College Trustees for the Community College League of California. [READ MORE](#)

The Community College League of California (CCLC) has elected Andra Hoffman to serve on the California Community College Trustees Board of the League (CCCT). The term is through July 2017; as the incumbent she will be eligible to serve three more terms. Hoffman was elected to the Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD) Board of Trustees in March 2015.

"It's an honor to be elected by the CCCT Board to fill this important vacancy," said Hoffman. "I'm proud to represent the nation's largest community college district on the CCCT Board and looking forward to working with my colleagues throughout the state on legislative and policy issues to provide increased access and affordability for anybody who wants to attend any of California's 113 community colleges."

The CCCT Board's primary mission – promoting and advancing public education by seeking citizen and legislative support for community colleges – dovetails with Hoffman's experience as an advocate for legislation that improves higher education. She has served on the CCLC's Advisory Committee for Legislation for the past five years and teaches California and American government as an adjunct professor in the political science department at Glendale Community College.

For nearly twenty years, Hoffman has been at Glendale Community College managing the Career and Job Placement Centers. These units represent key student support services that partner with business, industry and the community and collaborate with economic and workforce development partnerships to benefit students. She has served as Director of Government Relations for the college advocating on behalf of legislation affecting higher education. She continues to lobby for issues that affect California community colleges and organizes delegations of students, faculty and staff to represent those issues in Sacramento. One such issue is the California Dream Act, on which she has worked since the passage of AB 540 and continues to work on behalf of undocumented students to ensure their success.

Hoffman is past president of the National Women's Political Caucus of the San Fernando Valley and continues to mentor and support young women and girls. She attended Los Angeles Valley College, received her bachelor's degree in Liberal Studies from Antioch University, and has a master's degree in Public Administration from California State University, Northridge. She lives in Encino and has two grown children.

Since 2014, LAVC has been using Blackboard Connect to send emergency alert notifications to students, faculty and staff. This system allows the college to simultaneously send emergency notifications by email, voice message, and text message.

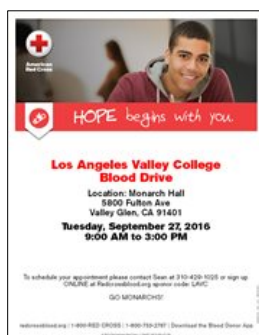

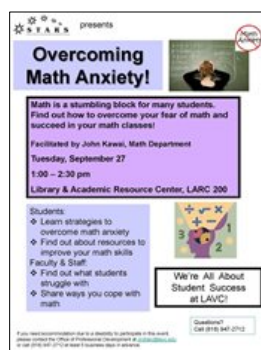

The LAVC Student Health Center and the American Red Cross will hold a LAVC Blood Drive on Tuesday, September 27 from 9 a.m.-3 p.m. in Monarch Hall, located in the Campus Center building.

Did you know that every time you donate blood you can help save up to three lives? Make a life-saving blood donation at this first campus blood drive of the Fall 2016 semester. All blood donors are encouraged to remember to bring their ID to the blood drive, drink plenty of water every day for two days before the drive, and have a good meal before making a blood donation. There now is no longer a deferral period for recent tattoos that are done in a licensed tattoo shop.

- [Men's Football](#) was off on September 17. On October 1, the team will face Victor Valley College on the gridiron at 6 p.m. in Monarch Stadium. Military personnel will also be honored at the game. Tickets are \$7 for adults and \$4 for students.
- [Men's Water Polo](#) will go up against Cuesta College on September 28 at 3 p.m. in the Aquatics Center. Admission is free.
- [Women's Soccer](#) recently tied Antelope Valley (0-0) but then lost to College of the Canyons (0-3). It will play Cerro Cerro College on September 27 at 4 p.m. and Oxnard College on September 30 at 6 p.m.; both games are in the Monarch Stadium and admission is free.

[WANT TO TAKE THE HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY TEST? LAVC OFFERS THE HISET AND PRACTICE TESTS](#)

Come to LAVC to take your HiSET (a high school equivalency test that is the alternate to the GED)! Sign up for the HiSET Practice Test on September 30 at 9 a.m. in Bungalow 14. It is also accepting registrations for the paper-based HiSET test on October 14 & 15 until October 5; the computer-based test is available by appointment only. [READ MORE](#)

The LAVC Specialized Testing Center in conjunction with the CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) Office is now accepting registrations for the official High School Equivalency Test (or HiSET®), and the HiSET® Practice Test.

The HiSET® is the new alternative to the GED; the CA State Board of Education approved the HiSET® for individuals to earn a California High School Equivalency Certificate. To be eligible to take the HiSET®, you must be a California resident, be 18 years or older, have a valid government issued identification, and not be currently enrolled in high school.

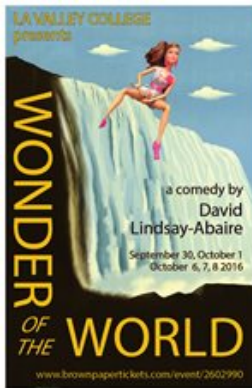
LAVC is an official HiSET® Testing Site, and it offers the following:

- The HiSET® paper-based test is held monthly on a Friday and Saturday (participants must attend both days for each session). Registration is now open for the paper-based test that will be offered on Friday-Saturday, October 14 and 14; the last day to register is October 5 in Bungalow 14. The computer-based test is available by appointment only. The fee for the full test is \$150.00 and additional fees may

apply (non-refundable). Space is limited and pre-registration is required.

- The HiSET® practice test will give you an idea of how well you may score on the official HiSET® test. The next available practice test will held on Friday, September 30 at 9 a.m. in Bungalow 14; registration is accepted on the day of the practice test. Practice tests are offered every Friday and by appointment. The fee for the test is \$10.00 (non-refundable).
