LOS ANGELES VALLEY COLLEGE TO OFFER A 5-WEEK WINTER SESSION; CLASSES START JANUARY 5

Over 100 CSU/UC Transferrable Class Sections Available

VALLEY GLEN, CA – Los Angeles Valley College (LAVC) announced that it will offer Winter Session 2015. Classes for the five-week session will be held from January 5-February 8. Day and evening classes will begin on January 5; Saturday classes will begin on January 10.

“Valley College is pleased to offer a broad selection of general education courses to help students start, continue or complete their transfer education to a four-year college or university,” said Dr. Erika Endrijonas, president of Los Angeles Valley College. “These courses not only satisfy University of California or California State University requirements, but will give our students the opportunity to earn credits towards a transfer associates degree.”

Winter Session 2015 will comprise of over 100 class sections offered a variety of degree-transferrable subjects including English, math and communications studies, and vocational education courses in administration of justice, child development and nursing. There will also be noncredit ESL course offerings. In addition, the college will offer tutoring and library services during selected hours to assist Winter Session students. Priority registration begins October 27, and continuing student registration begins October 30. Current LAVC students can find their Winter 2015 registration appointment by logging into the Student Information System at www.lavc.edu, and click on “Register for Classes”. To log in, enter their student identification number and pin number; select “View Registration Appointment” and then choose “Winter 2015”.

New and returning students will need to apply online at www.lavc.edu/. Online applications for new and returning students will be accepted until December 19. In-person applications will only be accepted from individuals who have received an add card from the instructor until January 9.
