Scholarship! Application Deadline Extended to March 20

The Los Angeles Valley College Foundation is accepting scholarship applications from LAVC students between January 20-March 20. The application deadline has been extended; the new deadline to submit an application for most scholarships is Friday, March 20 at 4 p.m. To be eligible for a scholarship, the individual must be registered and enrolled for the Spring 2015 semester at LA Valley College. The student must be prepared to answer questions (such as the Grade Point Average, the number of units that he/she has completed, and the area of study) so that Foundation staff can assist in providing the scholarship applications that the student may qualify for. International students may also apply. The LAVC Art Gallery will present a “Site Unseen: Incarceration” exhibit by guest curator Sheila Pinkel from March 12-April 23 in the LAVC Art Gallery in the Art Building. “Site Unseen: Incarceration” is a group

exhibition by incarcerated artists and non-incarcerated artists that deals with the issue of imprisonment. The exhibit features works by incarcerated artists who express their experience from inside the prison walls, and by non-incarcerated artists who tackle the American criminal justice system from outside its walls. It provides a multiplicity of perspectives on the prison experience, a phenomenon that is both intimidating and unfamiliar to the general public. 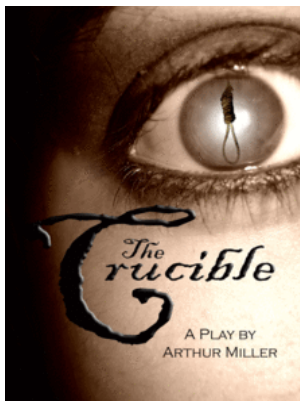
You're Invited to the LAVC CalWORKs Program's Open House on March 18
The LAVC CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) Program will be holding an open house on Wednesday, March 18 from 9:30-10:30 a.m. in Bungalow 14 and 15. The CalWORKs Office has recently expanded from its current location in Bungalow 14. Bungalow 15 (the old location of LAVC's historical museum) has been updated and remodeled, and will house the CalWORKs counselors, the Valley Assessment Center and the HiSET® (High School Equivalency Test) Program. The CalWORKs Program is an education and training program established for students who are receiving Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) benefits. The program offers assistance with educational planning, childcare, books, tutoring, paid work-study, internships, job placement, workshops, tutoring, mentoring, and other services. LAVC is an official HiSET® testing site, and the LAVC CalWORKs Program offers the HiSET® paper- and computer-based tests, and the HiSET® practice tests. Attention Faculty/Staff!—LAVC Emergency Alerts will Now be Sent to the Email Addresses and Phone Number Listed in the District Portal; Employees Urged to Update Their Information in PCR

Effective March 13, 2015, LAVC will send employees any campus emergency alerts to their work, home and/or cell phone number(s), and to their campus and personal email address(es) that are listed in the

[district portal \(PCR\)](#). Faculty and staff are encouraged to check their information on [PCR / District Portal](#) to ensure that they will continue to receive emergency alert notifications; any information entered into the **LAVC Connect Portal will no longer be used. Since 2014, LAVC has been using Blackboard Connect to send emergency alert notifications; this system allows the college to simultaneously send students, staff and faculty by email, voice, and text message. *In the event of a campus emergency, current students will automatically receive alert notifications to their LACCD email address and their primary phone number (according to the LACCD Student Information System); LAVC faculty and staff will automatically receive notifications to their LAVC email address, and to their work, home and cell phone numbers and personal email address (according to the District Portal)*. Students will still have to provide their cell phone and personal email address on the [LAVC Connect Portal](#) to receive emergency alert notifications by text and/or to their personal email.
