Final Week of the "Site Unseen: Incarceration" Exhibition at the LAVC Art

Gallery; Exhibition Closes on April 23

The LAVC Art Gallery is presenting a group exhibition on the issue of imprisonment by both incarcerated and non-incarcerated artists titled "Site Unseen: Incarceration" from March 12-April 23 in the LAVC Art Gallery in the Art Building. The exhibit by guest curator Sheila Pinkel features works by incarcerated artists who express their experience from inside the prison walls, and by non-incarcerated artists who tackle the American criminal justice system from outside its walls. It provides a multiplicity of perspectives on the prison experience, a phenomenon that is both intimidating and unfamiliar to the general public. Featured artists include Alyse Emdur, Anthony Friedkin, Los Angeles Poverty Department, Robert V. Montenegro, Jack L. Need to Take the HiSET® (High School Equivalency Test)? LAVC to Offer the Computer-Based and the Paper-Based Test; Practice Test Also Offered

The LAVC CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) Program is now accepting registrations for the HiSET® (High School Equivalency Test). LAVC is an official HiSET testing site; the computer-based tests will be offered on Tuesday-Wednesday, April 21-22 and the paper-based test on Friday-Saturday, April 24-25. It will also offer the practice test on Friday, April 24; practice tests are also available by appointment. HiSET® is the new alternative to the GED. The CA State Board of Education approved the HiSET® for individuals to earn a California High School Equivalency Certificate. It is offered as a paper-based or computer-based test, and covers the following subject areas: Language Arts- Reading & Writing,

Science, Social Studies and Mathematics. Both types of tests are offered on a regular basis. The fee for the full test is \$150.00 (non-refundable). The fee for the practice test is \$10. Did You Know that LAVC Students and Faculty Can Access Microsoft Office for Free? Come Get More Information on Using Office 365 on April 22

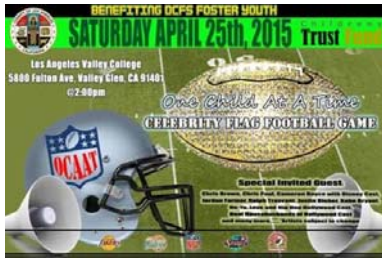

Microsoft representatives will be at LAVC on Wednesday, April 22 from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. in Library & Academic Resource Center 200 to encourage students, faculty and staff to use Office 365; there will be informational flyers, t-shirts and pizza. In addition, Microsoft reps will be at Southwest College on April 20 and City College on April 21 to engage with students and faculty throughout the District. Office 365 Education for Students is available for free to students who are enrolled at Los Angeles Valley College; Office 365 is available for faculty for free because Valley College uses Microsoft Office. Students and faculty will be able to access Microsoft Office's web-based applications on up to 5 PCs or Macs and on other mobile devices, including Android, iPad®, and Windows tablets.
