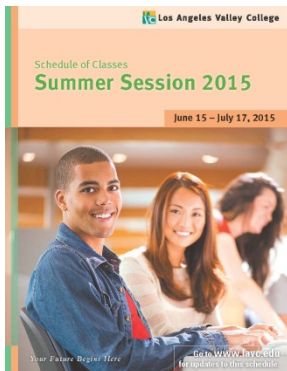

The LAVC Student Health Center and the Violence Prevention Advocacy Team will be offering several free workshops to raise awareness of sexual assault prevention during Sexual Assault Prevention month in April, and for Denim Day on April 29. - *Popcorn & a Movie with Peace Over Violence*—Peace Over Violence will facilitate a workshop on interpersonal violence that includes popcorn and a movie followed by a question and answers session on Monday, April 27 from 10-11 a.m. in the Fireside Room.

Summer Session 2015 will include degree-transferrable classes offered in a variety of disciplines, including English, Math, Chemistry, Biology, History, Political Science and Communication Studies. Phys 66 (to be offered in the Fall semester) has a prerequisite of Math 240 or its equivalent and a co-requisite of Math 265. Phy 67 (to be offered in the Spring semester) has a prerequisite of Phys 66 and Math 265. Both of these new courses are UC and CSU transferrable, and can replace Phys 6 or Phys 7 for transfer since they satisfy more requirements.
