LAVC TO OFFER OVER 150 CLASSES FOR WINTER SESSION 2016

Los Angeles Valley College (LAVC) announced that it will offer a 5-week winter session from January 4-February 7, 2016. Priority registration for designated groups begins on October 26. Winter session will feature more than 150 course sections in more than 40 disciplines including English, Math, Chemistry, Biology, Political Science, History, and Communication Studies. In addition, career technical education, basic skills, and noncredit courses will be offered. A listing of Winter Session 2016 classes is available on the LAVC Web site. "STEP FORWARD" THIS FALL! LATE-START CLASSES BEGINS ON OCTOBER 19

Fall Semester 2015 late-start courses at Los Angeles Valley College (LAVC) will begin the week of October 19. Students in these accelerated courses will be finished with their late-start class by the week of December 14. LAVC is offering 54 short-term, late-start class sections in the Fall 2015 Semester. These classes include a wide selection of UC/CSU-transferable including online or hybrid courses. About 80% of

the classes are being offered as online or hybrid classes. Fall 2015 late-start courses are being offered in the high-demand subjects of English, Math, Communication Studies, Anthropology, Political Science, Art, and more. FYI—Enrollment in late-start courses will be by instructor add card only. LAVC THEATER ARTS PRESENTS THE CRIPPLE OF INISHMAAN ON **OCTOBER 22-25**

The LAVC Theater Arts Department will present Martin McDonagh's Irish comedy The Cripple of Inishmaan on October 22-25 in the Horseshoe Theater in the Theater Arts Building. Evening performances will be held on Thursday, October 22, Friday, October 23, and Saturday, October 24 at 7 p.m. with matinée performances on Saturday, October 24, and Sunday, October 25 at 2 p.m. The Cripple of Inishmaan takes place on the remote island of Inishmaan, off the west coast of Ireland, circa 1934. The isolated islanders are excited to learn of the arrival of a Hollywood film crew on neighboring Inishmore, there to make a documentary about life on the Aran Islands. 17-year-old Billy Claven, desperate to escape the monotony of Inishmaan, is eager to be a part of the film. An orphan and outcast, "Cripple Billy" has been raised by his harsh but well-meaning aunties, Kate and Eileen, ever since his parents drowned in the rough seas off Inishmaan. It seems that nobody ever really wanted Billy, but perhaps Hollywood will? Maybe that will stop local newsman Johnny pateenmike's stupid gossiping about him? Or better yet, attract the attention of the beautiful yet terrifying Helen? But first he's got to find a way to cross the sea to Inishmore. Once there, will he ever come back? The production is directed by LAVC professor Cathy Susan Pyles, the scenery is designed by Brittany Cobb, the costumes by LAVC adjunct professor Mary Reilly, and the lighting by LAVC Performing Arts Technician Mark Svastics. STUDENT SERVICES ANNOUNCES A REORGANIZATION TO BETTER SERVE STUDENTS

The LAVC Student Services Division announced that it has been restructured into four units to better serve students. Student Services is the division of the college involved with student development outside of the confines of the classroom.

The Student Success and Support Services unit comprises of eight departments: Admissions & Records, Assessment Center, Career Transfer Center, Counseling, Financial Aid, International Students, Outreach/Recruitment, and Veterans Students. The Student Life unit oversees six areas of the campus: Associated Student Union, Child Development Center, Student Activities, Student Health Center, Psychological Services, and Title IX. The Special Programs unit manages eight special programs for students: SSD – Services for Students with Disabilities, CARE – Single Parents, EOPS – Extended Opportunity Programs & Services, Guardian Scholars – Foster Youth, TRiO/Student Support Services, TRiO/Upward Bound, TRiO/Upward Bound Math – Science, and STEM – Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics. The Office of Ombudsperson is the Ombudsperson for LAVC Student (including student grievances, grade grievances, and student code of conduct), the Ombudsperson for LAVC Employees, and the liaison for District Compliance Resources. The reorganization was necessary to streamline the reporting process, enhance the coordination of efforts, consolidate the distribution of fiscal resources, and improve the delivery of services to students. Dr. Douglas Marriott, will serve as the new Director of Workforce Training. In his previous position, he was the Director of Cooperative Education Program and the Job Resource Center. In this position, Doug will integrate and coordinate the services of Cooperative Education, Job Training, Extension and the Job Resource Center to assist students, community members, faculty, employers and community

partners with workforce training programs. In his new role, Doug looks forward to collaborating with faculty, staff, students as well as business, community and government partners to develop and expand comprehensive Workforce Development services and trainings. Under his leadership, the LAVC Coop Ed Program was recognized as the 2015 College Program of the Year by the California Internship & Work Experience Association for its "leadership and commitment to providing an exemplary Cooperative Education program that incorporates continuous improvement and encourages students to view the workplace as a lifelong learning environment." Doug has taught in the Psychology and English Departments at LAVC and directed specially funded workforce development training projects for the award winning LAVC Job Training Program. His background includes directing Adult Workforce Literacy programs for the Literacy Network of Greater Los Angeles as well as a federally funded program that allowed migrant workers to earn GEDs through Proyecto Avanzando. Additionally, he taught high school in Southeast Los Angeles and Central Japan and served as a Community Education Promoter for the U.S. Peace Corps in the Dominican Republic for three years. Doug serves as the volunteer Program Board Chairman for MEND (Meet Each Need with Dignity), a holistic poverty relief agency in the Northeast San Fernando Valley. Doug holds a Doctorate in Education from UCLA and his dissertation examined Community College Career and Technical Education student experiences and definitions of student success. Congratulations!
