[NEW SHORT-TERM, LATE-START CLASSES ADDED FOR SPRING 2016](#)

The LAVC Academic Affairs Office has added 13 new late-start class sections for the Spring 2016 semester. These new short-term class sections are available in the subjects of Philosophy, Communication Studies, Art, Health, History, Sociology, English and ESL Non-Credit. Most late-start classes will begin the week of April 11.

LAVC is offering more than 70 additional short-term class sections that start later in the Spring 2016 semester (commonly referred to as "late-start") to help students complete their degree, transfer sooner and/or reach their academic goals. [GO MONARCHS!—CONGRATS TO MEN'S AND WOMEN'S SWIMMING; UPCOMING HOME GAMES FOR SOFTBALL, BASEBALL, AND SWIMMING](#)

The LAVC Athletics Department congratulates the Men's and Women's Swimming team for its successful results at the WSC Swim Meet #2. Andrew Gianolio from Men's Swimming won the 50 free, and Tim Hornyak of Men's Swimming won the 200 IM and 200 breaststroke. In addition, Ken Sasagawa came in second in both the 200 IM and 200 breaststroke. The women's team

brought home two wins at the meet.

The following is an update on our Monarch Athletic teams (including all their upcoming games):

- [Baseball](#) recently suffered two losses to College of the Canyons (2-4, 5-6) before a one loss (2-11) and one win (2-0) against Oxnard. Next up, the team will play at three-game series's against Citrus College, Antelope Valley and Glendale College. In the Citrus series, the first will be at Citrus on March 29, followed by the second at home on March 31 at 2:30 p.m. and then the final game at Citrus on April 2. The series

versus Antelope Valley will first be played at home on April 5 at 2:30 p.m., then the second at Antelope Valley on April 7, and ending with final game at home on April 9 at 1 p.m. The Glendale series will be played at Glendale on April 12, then at Valley on April 14 at 2:30 p.m. and the final match up at Glendale on April 16. All home games are played on the LAVC Baseball field.

- [Softball](#) lost to Antelope Valley (5-11) before one win and two loss at the Santa Barbara tournament (4-3 vs Orange Coast; 4-5 vs Golden West; 2-8 vs Saddleback; 0-10 vs Fullerton). In its match up against Bakerfield, the Lady Monarchs had a win at home (8-3). Coming up, the team will play the next nine out of eleven games at home. The following games will be played at the LAVC Softball field; a double-header versus Citrus on March 29 at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m., a game against College of the Canyons on March 31 at 2:30 p.m., a double-header versus LA Mission on April 5 at 1 p.m. and 3 p.m., a game against Santa Monica on April 7 at 2:30 p.m., and a game versus Allen Hancock on April 9. The team will play a double-header at Antelope Valley on April 12, before returning home for games against Glendale on April 14 at 2:30 p.m. and against East LA on April 15 at 2:30 p.m. at the LAVC Softball field.
- [Men's Swimming and Diving](#) team took home 3-1 at the WSC #2 men's swimming meet at Santa Monica. Next, the team will compete in the WSC Swim Meet #3 on April 1 at 10:30 a.m. at LAVC's Aquatics Center, followed by the Pasadena Invitational on April 8-9.
- [Women's Swimming and Diving](#) team had a 2-2 results at the WSC Swim Meet #2 at Santa Monica. The team will next compete at the WSC Swim Meet #3 on April 1 at 10:30 a.m. at LAVC's Aquatics Center. Following that, they will compete in the Pasadena Invitational on April 8-9.

The LAVC Athletics Department's Monarch Athletics program comprises of 10 intercollegiate athletic teams. The Men's Football, Women's Soccer, and Men and Women's Water Polo teams play every fall. Spring team sports include Men's Baseball, Men's and Women's Basketball, Women's Softball, and Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving. 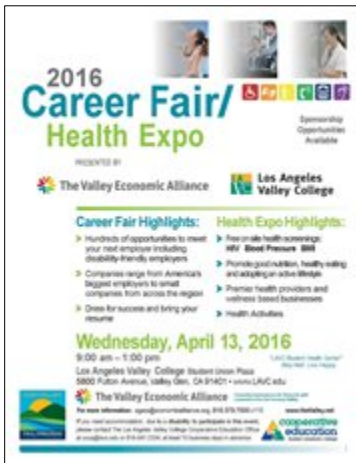

PLANNING TO TAKE THE HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALANCY TEST? LAVC OFFERS THE HISET TEST AND PRACTICE TESTS

The LAVC Specialized Testing Center in conjunction with the CalWORKs (California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids) Office is now accepting registrations for the official High School Equivalency Test (or HiSET®), and the HiSET® Practice Test.

The HiSET® is the new alternative to the GED; the CA State Board of Education approved the HiSET® for individuals to earn a California High School Equivalency Certificate. To be eligible to take the HiSET®, you must be a California resident, be 18 years or older, have a valid government issued identification, and not be currently enrolled in high school.

LAVC is an official HiSET® Testing Site, and it offers the following:

- The HiSET® paper-based test is held monthly on a Friday and Saturday (participants must attend both days for each session). Registration is now open for the paper-based test that will be offered on Friday-Saturday, April 22 and 23; the last day to register is April 13 in Bungalow 14. The computer-based test is available by appointment only. The fee for the full test is \$150.00 and additional fees may apply (non-refundable). Space is limited and pre-registration is required.
- The HiSET® practice test will give you an idea of how well you may score on the official HiSET® test. The next available practice test will held on Friday, April 15 at 9 a.m. in Bungalow 14; registration is accepted on the day of the practice test. Practice tests are offered Fridays and by appointment. The fee for the test is \$10.00 (non-refundable).

This well-known piece of public art by noted LA-muralist Kent Twitchell has a new home at Valley College. Originally painted near the 101 Hollywood Freeway, the mural was lost when it was painted over in 1986. After many years of trying to resurrect this iconic piece of Los Angeles public art, the LAVC Public Art Committee selected the repainting of Twitchell's "Freeway Lady" to be its first project on the campus. The mural has found its new home on the exterior of the

northwest side of the college's Student Services Center.
