[TRYING TO FIND AN OPEN CLASS? CHECK THE FALL 2016 CLASS SCHEDULE WEB PAGE](#)

The LAVC Academic Affairs Office has posted a list of classes that show indicates which classes still have open seats for the Fall Semester 2016.

Students can now check online at the "Class List by Subject" listing to see which classes in a discipline have open seats. Student are encouraged to check this listing often as some classes listed as full may have open seats when other students drop the class.

This Class List by Subject list is updated daily from the Los Angeles Community College District's LAColleges.net Web page. It lists of every class section at LAVC, and notes which classes have open seats and which classes are full.

CITY OF LA TO TEMPORARILY CLOSE A SECTION OF ETHEL AVENUE ON JULY 18-19

The City of Los Angeles is scheduled to begin roadway improvements on a portion of Ethel Avenue on Monday, July 18. The project is scheduled to be completed within four weeks, providing no extenuating circumstances arise.

The work involves grinding the existing asphalt and repaving Ethel Avenue from Oxnard Street to Hatteras Street. [View map of construction area](#)

If all goes according to plan, the city anticipates that Ethel Avenue will be closed from Monday, July 18-Tuesday, July 19, 2016.

Students, Faculty, Staff and Guests—Access to the campus parking Structure will be from the Oxnard Street campus entrance (at Campus Drive), which is located to the west of the Child Development and Family Complex. Vehicles will be able to drive south on Campus Drive, turn left onto Emelita Street, and enter the northern entrance of the Parking Structure on Emelita Street. [View campus map](#).

EOPS, CARE & GUARDIAN SCHOLARS NOW ACCEPTING STUDENTS!

The LAVC Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS), Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education (CARE) and Guardian Scholars programs are accepting new students for the Fall 2016 semester. Applications will be accepted until Friday, July 29 at 12 p.m. in the EOPS Office on the second floor of the Student Services Center.

Students who meet certain criteria (see [eligibility requirements](#)) can apply to be a part of one of the following programs:

- The EOPS Program is open to students who come from backgrounds who have historically experienced economic and educational challenges.
- The CARE (Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education) program is open to EOPS students who are single parents.
- The Guardian Scholars is open to current and former foster youth attending Valley College.

The EOPS (Extended Opportunity Programs and Services) program assists eligible students who have historically experienced economic and educational challenges. To increase access, retention and goal completion, it provides the following "over and above" services: academic counseling, tutoring, textbook vouchers, workshops, priority

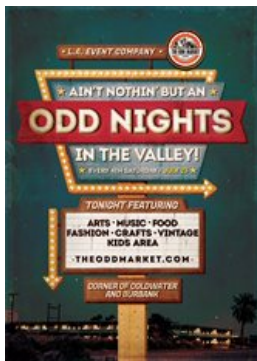

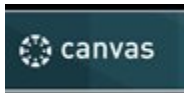
This evening Odd Market called "Odd Nights in the Valley" will feature a selection of curated vendors, gourmet food trucks, music, a Kids Area and more.
