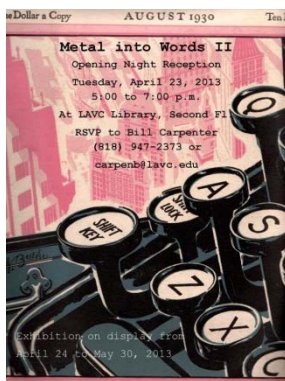

Come to the LAVC Astronomy Group's "Our Nearest Star: Space Weather and You" Lecture on May 5.** The LAVC Astronomy Group will present a "Our Nearest Star: Space Weather and You" lecture by Dr. Tamitha Mulligan Skov of The Aerospace Corporation on Sunday, May 5 at 7:45 p.m. in the LAVC Planetarium.
