



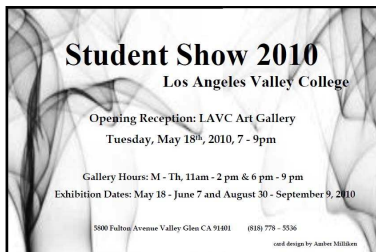

The LAVC Astronomy Group will hold a lecture on “CloudSat: How Clouds Affect Climate” on Sunday, May 16 from 7:45-9 p.m. in the LAVC Planetarium. This hour-long lecture on the CloudSat Earth-orbiting satellite will be presented by Dr. Deborah Vane of the Jet Propulsion Laboratory. CloudSat, which was recently launched by NASA, was designed to peer into the clouds to further our understanding about how they affect our climate. This lecture is free and open to the public; free parking will be available in College Road South (faculty parking lot). You're Invited to the "Why I Write Books For Children" Panel Symposium

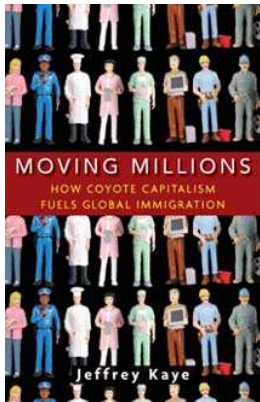

Two of LAVC's Mini Grant Projects Recognized at 2010 BESAC Curriculum Conference

LAVC recently received several recognitions including a Best Mini-Grant Proposal Award, a Best Mini-Grant Project Presentation Award, an Award of Excellence and a Faculty Scholarship Award for two of its mini grant projects at the 2010 Business Education State Advisory Committee (BESAC) Curriculum Conference in Costa Mesa, California. ***The college received a Best Mini-Grant Proposal Award and a Best Mini-Grant Project Presentation Award for its "Training Faculty to Use a Social Networking Site for Both Face-to-Face and Online Courses" project.*** The project taught faculty in LAVC's Computer Science & Information Technology (CSIT) and Business departments to use social networking sites like Facebook and Twitter in class assignments for students. The project presentation was given by Mike Cooperman, and there was a lot of interest from other participants on how to utilize social networking in the classroom or in their businesses. ***In addition, the CalWORKs Program received an Award of Excellence for its "Work-Experience Program" project presentation and a Faculty Scholarship Award of \$300.*** The project was designed to provide students with the opportunity to gain real-world experiences. Students learn how to apply principles and concepts learned in college-level courses and workshops, and they earn college credit while gaining hands-on experience and building a network of employer contacts. The program placed 8 qualified LAVC Business major students in part-time, learning-based employment, in the fields of their choice with local companies and organizations. This program offers education and guidance in all aspects of career development, including self-assessment, occupational exploration, decision-making, job search, and success in the workplace. Lale Yutseven, business professor and BIC Executive Member West Valley College, was the LAVC CalWORKs project manager. The following members of the CalWORKs team assisted with the "Work-Experience Program" project: Alicen Vera, Norma Smith, Yasmin Aviles and Lila Steinberg. This year's BESAC conference emphasized technology presentations, demonstrations, panel discussions and 2009 mini-grant reports. Both educators and businesses attended and brought valuable input to this conference. Congratulations!
