About 600,000 L.A. Community College Students to Get Microsoft Live@EDU

PC World featured a story on the Los Angeles Community College District’s decision to provide email and collaboration applications to about 600,000 students via Microsoft’s Live@EDU cloud suite. The LACCD plans to start the rollout in the fall, focusing initially on its current students. The free Live@EDU system will include features such as calendaring, IM and audio/video conferencing, document creation, editing, storage, sharing and collaboration through SkyDrive, and online versions of Microsoft productivity applications including Word, Excel, PowerPoint and OneNote. Locals react to Gov. Jerry Brown’s nearly \$16B budget deficit

LAVC and the other community colleges in the San Fernando Valley were mentioned in a Daily News article on Governor Jerry Brown’s proposed budget cuts. This plan, which would slash Medi-Cal and social services, close certain state facilities on Fridays, and ask state workers to take a 5 percent pay cut. This cut is in addition to the fee increases already in the works for California Community Colleges, and California State University, and possibly the University of California.
