CHEM 101- General Chemistry I (UC/CSU) - 5 Units*Requirement Designation:* Meets IGETC 5A 5C CSU B1 B3**Enrollment Requirement:** CHEM 060 AND Math 125 OR CHEM 068 AND MATH 125 with a grade of C or better.

This is the first semester of a one-year course in general chemistry intended for majors in the natural sciences, (chemistry, biochemistry, biology, physics, pre-medicine), mathematics and engineering. Topics presented in this course include chemical nomenclature, atomic structure, quantum theory, bonding theories and molecular geometries, chemical equations, oxidation-reduction, stoichiometry, thermochemistry, solid, liquid and gaseous states and related forces, gas laws, solutions and colligative properties, periodic relationships, and acid-base theories.
