Report on Student Characteristics and Success Indicators

Number of Undocumented Students in the LACCD and at Each College (Fall 2017)

- In Fall 2017 there were 11,721 undocumented students enrolled in LACCD colleges
 - 6,337 Credit Students
 - 5,384 Non-credit students
- This is about 7.8% of all enrolled students
 - 4.7% of Credit students
 - 38.0% of Non-credit students

Credit Students enrolled at LACCD, Fall 2017

Changes in Undocumented Students Demographics Since Fall 2016

- There was an overall increase in the number of undocumented students from Fall 2016 to Fall 2017 (+220). While the number of non-credit only students increased by 8.4% (+417 students), the number of credit students decreased by 3% (-197 students) within the same time frame.
- AB 540 Students were greatly impacted; there were 598 less credit and non-credit students enrolled in in Fall 2017, a 10.3% decrease since Fall 2016.

Academic Outcomes of Undocumented and All LACCD Students

- Undocumented students had **higher Fall to Fall persistence** rates (67%) when compared to all LACCD students (60%)
- A lower proportion of undocumented students had **any completion** outcome (9%) (i.e., degree, certificate, transfer) compared to all LACCD students (13%)
- A much lower proportion of undocumented students **transferred** (2%) compared to all LACCD students (8%)
- In general, milestones completion rates for undocumented students was higher when compared to all LACCD students
