- IV. **Quorum:** Eighteen (18) of the twenty-eight (28) clubs were present. Quorum was met.
- V. **Approval of Minutes:** Samuel motions to amend the minutes by changing “Sam Aries” to “Samuel Arias”. Writers seconded the motion. Aidan motions to amend the minutes by changing “Aiden” to “Aidan”. Business seconds the motions. Internal students motions to amend the minutes by changing “International Club” to International Students Club”. Abilities motions to approve the amended minutes. French seconded the motion. Unanimous vote of approval. Motion passed.
- VI. **Approval of Agenda:** Samuel motions to amend the agenda by changing “XI. H. Club Day” to “XI. H. Club Day Committee”. Writers seconded the motion. Writers motions to approve the amended agenda. Business seconded the motion. Unanimous vote of approval. Motion passed.
- VII. **Open Forum:**  
Ani Apikyan: As Political and External Affairs commissioner, Ms. Apikyan is asking for volunteers, specifically four (4) members from the ICC, to form an External Operation Committee and a Lobby Committee. These committees will inform students and officers of LAVC about the California legislative process and laws and/or bills being passed in the state law of California.  
Maricela Garcia: Introduced herself as commissioner of Student Life. Ms. Garcia has informed ICC about their printing status which originally were ten (10) pages per month now has increased to thirty (30) pages per month.  
Eddie Kaufman-Morrow: Eco Advocates are accepting students for Climate Change Strike at City Hall on March 15, 2019 at 9 A.M. to 9:30 A.M. Meeting will be held on March 14, 2019 at 3 P.M. in AHS room 310.  
Unity Club: Establishing a Unity Club on LAVC Campus which will help students in achieving their career goals by mentoring and training students for their field.
- VIII. **Officers Report:**  
Sebastian Diaz: From the Executive Council meeting, Mr. Diaz gave ICC a synopsis of the approved items. 1) \$3,000 was approved for water filters if IEC funds the library request to retro fit ten (10) water fountains throughout campus. Library is requesting grant from IEC to retro fit ten (10) water fountains throughout campus. 2) Spring 2019 SSCCC GA was approved for \$5,000. 3) Transportation Fee (\$13) Referendum to the Ballot in April 2019 – will allow students, per semester, to get a U-Pass – was approved for voting. However, once payment is finalized individual cannot opt-out. 4) Jose Romo, commissioner of Ethnic and Cultural Affairs, is putting on an International Women’s Month Film Series starting on March 18, 2019; Hidden Figures is set to be presented on March 20, 2019.
