#### Microcomputer Literacy I and Microcomputer Literacy II

These open-entry, open-exit courses familiarize students with computer workplace skills, word-processing, basic spreadsheet, PowerPoint, and Internet applications.

#### **Entertainment Business and Entertainment Contracts and Negotiations**

Learn the fundamentals of the business of

entertainment with an emphasis on finding work in this industry, understanding legal aspects of managing projects, and contracts.

#### **Gig Economy Careers in Entertainment**

These courses cover the development process, the role of the first assistant director, managing the creative environment on set, and business aspects of entertainment.



#### **Fundamentals and Practical Robotics**

These classes cover designing, building, and programming robots and Programmable Logic Controllers (PLC).

# Introduction and Fundamentals of Insurance

These classes explore the insurance industry and focus on property/casualty insurance markets to prepare individuals for the field (e.g., sales administration, agent training, insurance adjusting).

#### Jewish Non-Profit Work

Students will explore fundamentals for working with Jewish non-profits, delivery of services, and program management.

Welcome to Los Angeles Valley College Workforce Development!

Our department works directly with community and industry partners to create pathways to employment and career advancement for those we serve.

We are currently recruiting for Spring 2021 **Advanced Manufacturing and** 

**Biotech Manufacturing Academies.** These six-week intensive academies place over 90% of participants with partnering industry employers.

Biomanufacturing technicians clean and sanitize equipment in biomedical, biopharmaceutical,



and bioindustrial settings. For example, they manufacture life-saving pharmaceuticals for patients. Biomanufacturing technicians utilize current manufacturing practices, standard operating procedures, critical thinking, good communication, and teamwork.

Are you a parent of a child under age 18? Are you financially stressed? Do you need more resources for your family? Apply for **CalWORKs!** 

CalWORKs is a public assistance program that provides cash aid, services, and resources to eligible families. You can apply online at https://yourbenefits.laclrs.org/ybn/Index.html. Once approved, you may qualify for GAIN (Greater Avenues for Independence), a program that helps

CalWORKs participants prepare for work, find or get a better job, and stay employed.

Whether you are in pursuit of a career or attending college, earning a high school equivalency credential is vital! We offer practice testing and software programs to prepare you for the **HiSET** and **GED** exams. Subject areas include language arts, reading, writing, science, social studies,

"Two years ago, I came to the LAVC CalWORKs office to receive educational, vocational, and personal plans. At that time, I had no place to live, no job to support myself financially, and no guidance on how to choose my major. I met with a CalWORKs case manager, counselor, and coordinator who helped me with on-campus work study, placing my son in the childcare center, registration, educational plan, and workshops to help me become a student again.

Since then, I completed all Registered Nurse pre-requisites, earned a 4.00 GPA, received various



scholarships, worked and supported myself financially, attended weekly sessions with a licensed social worker, received my books and supplies, received weekly food supplies, and received clothing and help with my college applications. I chose the best program which works with my lifestyle and raising my son. I will start the RN program in Jan 2021. I already moved and have my own apartment, transferred all paperwork to the new county, and found a childcare center for my son. I was determined to change my life, and I was fortunate to receive CalWORKs resources and services."
