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Enrollment Priority and/or California College Promise Grant Appeal Instructions

A student who remains on academic/progress probation for two-consecutive terms and those who have completed 100 or more degree-applicable units in the Los Angeles Community College District (LACCD) will be ineligible to receive Enrollment Priority and/or California College Promise Grant. As a result students may lose the opportunity to enroll in the courses they need to meet their educational goals. In order to appeal the loss of enrollment priority and/or California College Promise Grant, the student must complete the following:

- 1. Fill out the Enrollment Priority and/or California College Promise Grant Appeal.
- 2. Attach a type-written statement explaining the reasons for your academic/progress performance.
- 3. Collect documents supporting the reasons for your academic/progress performance.

 If you are requesting an appeal due to extenuating circumstances including: accidents, illness or other circumstances beyond your control, supporting documents may include: a letter from your doctor, Police Accident Reports, Notifications of job loss from your employer, etc.)
- 4. Schedule an appointment to meet with a counselor to create a Comprehensive Student Educational Plan (SEP). When making an appointment, let the scheduler know you are requesting an Enrollment Priority and/or California College Promise Grant Appeal. Bring this form, your typed statement and supporting documentation with you to your appointment.
 If you are a CalWorks, EOPS, SSD or TRIO student, you will get your SEP from the counselor in those programs. Foster Youth are exempt from this process.
- 5. Submit your appeal to the Office of Admissions and Records once you have:
 - a. completed this petition, written your statement and collected the required documentation.
 - b. met with your counselor.

Any missing information will result in your Enrollment Priority/California College Promise Grant Appeal being denied by the Petitions Committee.

All Appeals, student statements, and documentation must be submitted to Admissions & Records by the established deadline.

Planning ahead is very important!
