Club Point System

All Charted Clubs at LAVC by the ASU will be entered in a Merit based system. The merit-based system will be known as CLUB POINTS and calculated in a manner based off club participation within itself and with the ASU, as well as other criteria. Points will be awarded by the Vice President and will be divided into three tiers of recognition status.

Only one award of first, second, and third place will be awarded. First place will go to the club with the overall highest point count. Second place will go to the club with the second highest point count. Third place will go to the club with the third highest point count. To be eligible for first place, which is a monetary reward of \$300, the club must reach a minimum of 100 points. To be eligible for second place, which is a monetary reward of \$200, the club must reach a minimum of 90 points. To be eligible for third place, which is a monetary reward of \$100, the club must reach a minimum of 80 points.

Up to eight additional awards will be granted to the clubs with the eight remaining highest point counts and who were not eligible for first, second, or third place status but meet the minimum eligibility of 50 points. The remaining awards will be a monetary reward of \$50.

Points may be earned in several ways. The chart below summarizes the list of possible ways to earn points.

VICE PRESIDENT'S DISCRETION (Max Points will vary)	Additional Points Vary		In unusual set of circumstances, the chair of ICC may choose to award points to any club towards contribution to enrichment of student life on campus. However, such an action could be contested by any club before the ICC with the absolute majority

By the end of each semester, each club will be awarded with a certificate recognizing club's standing.

Although the certificate will be presented to each club the monetary awards will be LIMITED to the end of the spring semester. The club that attains 'First' status award must have a minimum of 100 points; followed by the club that attains 'Second' status award must have a minimum of 90 points; and the club that attains 'Third' status award must have a minimum of 80 points. The awards will be determined by the amount of points you have earned. For example:

Club 1 has 125pts (club 1 will be awarded \$300)

Club 2 has 120pts (club 2 will be awarded \$200)

Club 3 has 100pts (club 3 will be awarded \$100)

Additionally, \$50 will be rewarded to the first eight remaining clubs who have reached 50 points or more. For example:

Club 4 has 90pts (club 4 will be awarded \$50)

Club 5 has 88pts (club 5 will be awarded \$50)

Club 6 has 80pts (club 6 will be awarded \$50)

Club 7 has 75pts (club 7 will be awarded \$50)

Club 8 has 70pts (club 8 will be awarded \$50)

Club 9 has 65pts (club 9 will be awarded \$50)

Club 10 has 50pts (club 10 will be awarded \$50)

In conclusion, regardless of status each monetary reward will be distributed to the highest number of total points and will continue from there. This is to encourage active participation from each club throughout the semester regardless of status. At the end of the academic year the club which has earned the most points throughout the entire year will be dubbed CLUB OF THE YEAR and presented with a trophy.
